## EUCCHARISTIC PROCESSION

For the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Jesus, there has been in times past a tradition of a Eucharistic procession following Mass.

Many parishes would carry the Blessed Sacrament in the monstrance though the streets to a designated location for prayer. Many times, the alternate location was a cemetery or perhaps a Eucharistic Chapel. Along the route, there would be altars of adoration set up, where particular prayers would be recited and/or hymns chanted. The people would follow in procession, stopping along the way for reflection, and stay extra time at the final destination for private prayer.

I am not aware of the particular traditions at St. Bartholomew or Sacred Heart parishes. While digging through closets and boxed items at Sacred Heart, I found parts of a processional canopy used for such events. With both of the cemeteries at distance from the parishes, and neither having a Eucharistic Chapel, I am not sure what the past practice has been for either place. If anyone has pictures of these events in either community, I would love to see them. I am also looking for photos of the sanctuaries from both churches before modern renovations (perhaps in a wedding photo).

Eucharistic Processions are a beautiful expression of our love for Jesus in the Body and Blood of Christ. May we continue to honor that sacred and true presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist: Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.

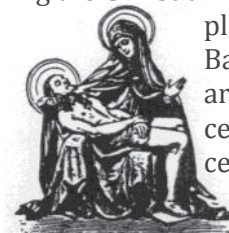

## Prayer Chain Requests

**Baptism Class** : Baptism class is required before a first Baptism. Baptism classes are held in the months of January, April, July and October. Parents are encouraged to attend a Baptism class before the birth of their first child. For questions contact Deacon Frank (634-4394). Preregistration is required.

**The Wedding Policy of the Diocese of St. Cloud** requires that you contact the parish at least 6 months prior to your wedding. This is necessary so that all the required steps can be completed in a timely manner. For second marriages, more time may be required. To begin your marriage preparation or for questions about the marriage preparation policy, contact Father Michael at the parish office (634-3813).
