Taking a child, he placed it in their midst,  
and putting his arms around it, he said to them,  
“Whoever receives one child such as this in my name,  
receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not  
me but the One who sent me.” - Mk 9:36-37

## Where do the wars and where do the conflicts among you come from?

(James 3:16-4:3)

A young man published his college dissertation in which he argued that religion is the root of all wars and conflicts among people. A similar thought was promoted by the Beatles' song "Imagine". These views ignore the realities of social economic conditions.

Recent presidents have been careful to avoid calling our current struggles with terrorism a religious war. The three common causes of conflict are the desire for power, territory and natural resources. James suggests conflict is the result of people striving for things that are not good for them. Wise people choose peace and mercy. This is the simple message of Jesus. Choose what is good for us, rather than what causes harm to others.

Our faith calls us to put away our desire to rule over others, and to remember every soul is a child of God. We have a powerful weapon against terror in our ability to pray. The Rosary is one prayer that is easy to pray and reflects on the moments of Jesus' life.

Our thoughts and prayers go out to the families of victims of September 11, 2001.

Thank you to Bishop Kettler for presiding over the Installation Mass. It was good to visit with him. Many Thanks also to the Knights of Columbus for putting on the Pork Chop Supper. We appreciate your dedication and contributions to our parishes.

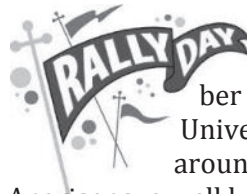

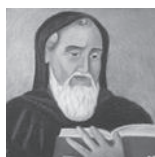
