"Yet to all who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God." John 1:12

Imagine you met a man who claimed to be God, he did miraculous things that only God could do but then he died. This might lead people to doubt his original claim. Perhaps the man wasn't God but only someone really blessed by God, perhaps a prophet with a special position.



Jesus Christ provided the ultimate proof to his claim of being God. He rose from the dead! When you examine the facts that surround the resurrection of Jesus you can't logically deny it occurred. Anzac Day

ANZAC DAY - 25TH APRIL 2015 100 YEARS CELEBRATION

This year Saturday 25 April 2015 marks the 100th Anniversary of landing of Anzac troops at Gallipoli.

Anzac Day goes beyond the anniversary of the landing at Gallipoli in 1915. It is the day in which we remember Australians who served and died in all wars, conflicts, and peacekeeping operations. The spirit of Anzac, with its human qualities of courage, mateship and sacrifice, continues to have meaning and relevance for our sense of national identity.

Anzac day this year falls on the Saturday, the first weekend in Term 2.

Our Primary and Secondary School Captains will attend the Casino Dawn service at the Mafeking Lamp starting at 5.30am to lay a wreath on behalf of the school.

We would like to encourage all our students and staff to participate in the main marches at Casino or Kyogle.

Casino's main march will comence at 10.15am, followed by commemorative service outside Casino RSM Club. Please meet at Graham Place (near the Town Library) by 10am.

Kyogle main march leaves the cenotaph at 10.30am followed by commemorative service at Kyogle Memorial Hall at 11am.


School Reports
