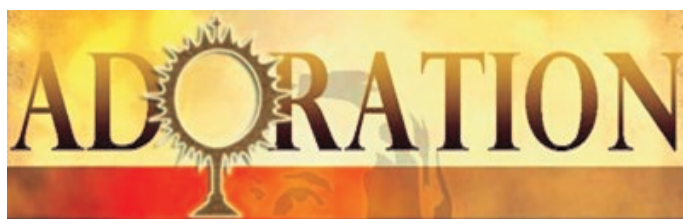

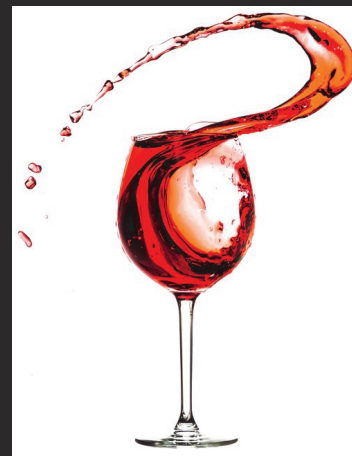

"Helicopters and Hoverboards: Challenges & Opportunities of Parenting in the 21st Century."

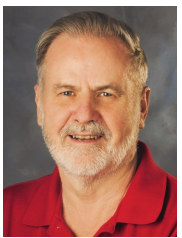
It seems that today's parents continually struggle to find the right balance between support/nurturance and fostering independence. In a culture where we hear the terms "Helicopter Parenting" and "Overparenting," many wonder if they are striking the appropriate balance of support and empowerment, while remaining true to their personal values and hopes for their children. Join us as we consider these challenges in an educational session and conversation based on the book, "How to Raise an Adult: Break Free of the Overparenting Trap and Prepare your Kid for Success," by Julie Lythcott-Haims, the former freshmen Dean at Stanford University. Her areas of specialization are health psychology, adolescent development, parenting and developmental knowledge, and sociocultural perspectives on women and diagnosis. She is also a licensed clinical Psychologist and has many years of experience working with children, adolescents, and their families. She regularly presents in various local Dioceses addressing the challenges families face in the 21st century and how to apply mindful techniques to help families stay connected.

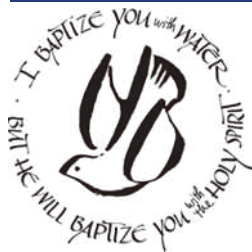

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION



The poetry of today's Responsorial Psalm has helped the faithful of every age appreciate and praise the majestic works of God: "spread out the heavens like a tent cloth," make the clouds your chariot," "renew the face of the earth." This is

the God to whom our Baptism joins us. We heard the last part of the Second Reading at the Christmas Mass at Dawn; now on this feast we focus on the "bath of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit" that Christ "poured out on us". We learn that our own Baptism trains us "to reject godless ways and worldly desires and to live temperately, justly and devoutly." In Luke's account of Jesus' baptism, John makes a distinction between the baptism he performs, a baptism for repentance, and the one Jesus will give, the one we received for transformation and mission. In the Gospel, we also hear the Father's joyful affirmation of his Son as "beloved", something we may not remember hearing at our own Baptism. As the Christmas decorations are packed away for another year, now is a good time to listen to those words again and claim them.
