Recipe Corner

Grilled Salmon

It's summer time and you know what that means! Fire up that grille on the back porch for some eats!

Ingredients

- -11/2 pounds salmon fillets
- -Lemon pepper to taste
- -Garlic powder to taste
- -Salt to taste
- -1/₃ cup soy sauce
- -1/₃ cup brown sugar
- -1/₃ cup water
- -1/4 cup vegetable oil

Directions

- 1. Season salmon fillets with lemon pepper, garlic powder, and salt.
- 2. In a small bowl, stir together soy sauce, brown sugar, water, and vegetable oil until sugar is dissolved. Place fish in a large resealable plastic bag with the soy sauce mixture, seal, and turn to coat. Refrigerate for at least 2 hours.
- 3. Preheat grill for medium heat.
- 4. Lightly oil grill grate.

Place salmon on the preheated grill, and discard marinade. Cook salmon for 6 to 8 minutes per side, or until the fish flakes easily with a fork.

Ford Fun Facts for June

In June 1940 the US was in the midst of rearming itself for possible German attacks on US soil when Ford was asked to build Rolls-Royce designed engines for the RAF and US airplanes by former Ford employee and now of the US office of Production Management, William Knudson. Edsel

Ford approved the request, but as soon as it hit the press his father, Henry Ford, cancelled the order. As war increasingly looked certain Henry Ford silenced his critics by reversing the order and by May of 1941 had opened a plant at Willow Run to build B24 Liberators.
