Where would you rather be – the mountains or the sea? Create a quilt showing the flavor of your special area. Let your imagination run wild! It could be traditional blocks, an art quilt, a scenic or landscape quilt, or whatever masterpiece reflects your favorite location.

1. Each fabric can be used only once. The size of the fabric doesn't matter and each piece can be a different size.

2. Perimeter not to exceed 200 inches, but must be at least 100 inches.

3. You may use any method or methods that you prefer – paper piecing, piecing, appliqué, etc. Feel free to use any embellishments that you would like, such as buttons, feathers, embroidery,

4. The entry must be made entirely by the entrant.

5. Challenge quilts must follow the general guidelines of the quilt show and have a four inch sleeve. However, there is no entry fee and there is no photo required with the entry form.

Gate City Quilters **Fiesta of Quilts 2014** Quilt Show Guidelines

- 1. Each entered item must have its own entry form. Entry fee for each quilt is \$5 for Gate City Quilt Guild members, \$10 for non-members. *There is no entry fee for the Sea or Mountains challenge.*
- 2. Entry Forms, photos and payment must be received by **April 1, 2014**. You will receive email confirmation when your entry has been received.
- 3. Entries may not have previously been exhibited in any Gate City Quilt Guild quilt show.
- 4. Entries must have been completed within the previous five (5) years.
- 5. No knitted, crocheted, or other crafts will be accepted.
- 6. The show committee and/or judges reserve the right to assign categories.
- 7. Entries must be completed and clean.
- 8. All quilts larger than 96" perimeter must have a **finished 4-5" deep hanging sleeve** securely attached.
- 9. Entries must have a label on the back lower right corner with the quilt name, maker name, address, and phone number. Use safety pins to place a piece of muslin over the label; it will be removed after judging.
- 10. Group Quilts include quilts made by 3 or more people in all categories.
- 11. Miniature Quilts are made from blocks 4" or smaller and are miniature versions of larger quilt block patterns. Perimeter is 50" or less.
- 12. Scrap quilts must contain at least 50 different fabrics.
- 13. Quilts must be received no later than noon on Friday, May 2, 2014.
- 14. Quilts may be dropped off at the Gate City Quilt Guild meeting in May. They may also be dropped off at the Studio Stitch shop on April 29-30 from 10:30-noon.
- 15. Each quilt must be placed in a pillow case with the name of the quilt, entrant's name, address, and phone number clearly labeled on the outside of the pillowcase.
- 16. All quilts must be picked up on Saturday May 10 between 5:30 pm and 6:00 pm at the First Baptist Church unless other arrangements have been made in advance. Gate City Quilt Guild will not be responsible for any unclaimed quilts.
- 17. Entries will not be returned by mail.
- 18. You must present the entry claim card in order to claim a quilt.

Awards:

Ribbons may be awarded at the discretion of the judges for 1st, 2nd, 3rd place, and Honorable Mention. Ribbons will also be awarded for the following:

- Best of Show
- Viewer's Choice
- Judge's Choice
- Best Use of Color
- Best Reflects Theme of Show
- Best Hand Quilting
- Best Home Sewing Machine Quilting
- Best Long Arm Machine Quilting
- Most Creative
