

Head Coach Chris Brown



Chris Brown enters his fifth season as head coach of Fort Hays State in 2015. He has guided FHSU to 22 wins in four years, including a sevenwin season in 2014, the school's first since 1996.

Name:

The Tigers have shown steady progress under Brown, posting a one-win improvement in each of the last three seasons. After finishing with a 4-7 mark in his first year (2011), the Tigers finished 5-6 in 2012, 6-5 in 2013, and then 7-4 in 2014. The most impressive part of the seven-win 2014 season was all wins were in MIAA play, arguably the nation's premier Division

II conference. Fort Hays State's previous high for MIAA wins in a season was four. FHSU joined the conference in 2006.

Brown, now 22-22 overall, came to Fort Hays State from Washburn University, where he served as the defensive coordinator and defensive secondary coach from 2002-2010 and assistant head coach in 2010.

FHSU enjoyed its most All-MIAA selections under Brown in each of the last two years (2013 and 2014) with 12. Brown has now coached 40 All-MIAA selections at Fort Hays State, including four first-team selections.

Brown has coached three All-Americans at FHSU, two in 2011 and one in 2014. That list includes linebacker Alex Whitehill, punter Ethan Kosjer, and safety Micheal Jordan. Whitehill led NCAA Division II and set a new Fort Hays State single-season record with 164 tackles in 2011, which was just five short of the Division II single-season record. Whitehill earned multiple All-American honors and was a CoSIDA/Capital One Academic All-American. Kosjer led Super Region 4 and ranked third in NCAA Division II in punting after averaging 44.4 yards per punt in 2011. He set new single-season (44.4) and career (41.4) records at FHSU for punting average and was also named to multiple All-America teams. Jordan recorded 80 tackles in 2014, adding an interception, a sack, two fumble recoveries, and an MIAA-best four forced fumbles. He had a hand in seven turnovers in 2014 for the Tigers.

Before coming to Hays, Brown helped Washburn compile a 62-41 record in his nine-year span with the program, which included two NCAA playoff appearances and two bowl wins. In his time at Washburn, Brown coached the 2009 and 2006 MIAA Most Valuable Defensive Players and guided two players selected in the NFL Draft (defensive tackle Trey Lewis-6th round 2007, and cornerback Cary Williams-7th round 2008). Brown also coached six All-Americans, 20 all-region and 41 All-MIAA selections at Washburn. His defense led the MIAA in turnovers gained in three of his final four seasons there, including a school record-tying 23 interceptions in 2007.

Brown joined the Washburn coaching staff after spending three years as the secondary coach at Liberal High School where he helped the team to a mark of 37-5 in his time.

Brown, a native of Liberal, Kan., is a 1996 graduate of Pittsburg State University where he recorded 470 tackles in 43 starts in his career at free safety. He is one of only three Gorillas to earn All-American honors three times. He was a unanimous All-American First Team selection his senior season and was named the CNN Division II National Player of the Year in 1995. He was also named to the NCAA Quarter Century Team for all players from 1975 to 1999 at free safety. He had a record 21 tackles in the NCAA Division II National Championship as a freshman against Jacksonville State. Brown was inducted into the Pittsburg State Athletic Hall of Fame in 2006.

He and his wife, Daphne, have two sons, Hunter and Hayden.
