Kiss and Drop Zone

The safety of our children and families is imperative. Therefore, we have reviewed the procedure for collecting children after school from the kiss and drop zone to ensure this.

- If a child can see their car approaching (within the next 5 cars) then they can come down the stairs and wait for their car
- Duty teachers will also go between cars, asking families for the names of the children they are collecting and then walking these children to their car.

Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ

Last Sunday was the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ.

The Feast of Corpus Christi, or the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ (as it is often called today), goes back to the 13th century, but it celebrates something far older: the institution of the Sacrament of Holy Communion at the Last Supper.

For centuries after the celebration was extended to the universal Church, the feast was also celebrated with a eucharistic procession, in which the Sacred Host was carried throughout the town, accompanied by hymns and litanies. The faithful would venerate the Body of Christ as the procession passed by. In recent years, this practice has almost disappeared, though some parishes still hold a brief procession around the outside of the parish church.

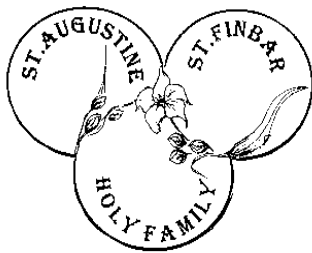

Dear parishioners,

FR PETER MCINTYRE 1932 TO 2015

Fr Peter McIntyre was born in Salisbury on 31 October 1932. He was educated at Sacred Heart College, Somerton Park, at St Francis Xavier's Seminary in Adelaide, and at St Patrick's College, Manly. On 21 July 1956, he was ordained priest at St Francis Xavier's Cathedral, and served all his nearly 59 years as a priest in our Archdiocese.

Fr Peter served as assistant priest in Kapunda, Parkside, and Woodville parishes for nearly a decade. In 1965 he served as parish priest in Kingston parish, from 1969 in Enfield-Greenacres, from 1982 in Goodwood, and from 1992 in Glenelg. He retired in 2008, and was named *Pastor Emeritus* in that year.

A reserved man, who did not always enjoy good health, Fr Peter was committed to the celebration of Mass and his pastoral duties. He enjoyed the confidence of his fellow priests, who elected him to the Senate of Priests (twice) and to the Priestly life and Ministry Committee. He served as advisor to some of the younger priests, even beyond our Archdiocese.

After his retirement, his health gradually declined, and he was finally admitted to Mary Potter House in North Adelaide some time before his death. He died on 26 June 2015. His funeral was conducted on 2 July 2015, in the parish church at Glenelg, his last parish. About 200 of his family, friends, and former parishioners attended, and forty clergy from Adelaide and Port Pirie diocese. Please say a little prayer for Fr Peter, as you pray for all our faithful departed.

Although he never served as priest in Salisbury parish, Fr Peter never forgot his family connections with the parish, and with the area. His body was returned to Salisbury for private burial on 3 July in our Pioneer Catholic Cemetery. He is the third priest buried there, along with Fr William Flanagan and Fr Aldo de Luca.
