Sighing for the Shade

Last week some of us headed off to the movies, supermarkets, or shopping complexes to find some relief from the heat. Our poor plane trees in front of the church are shedding their leaves even though it is not yet autumn. It is not just us but even animals, shrubs and trees are stressed. Struggles, boredom, toil, stress, illness do plague us at times, and even the weather pattern has an effect on our lives. All these factors become part of our lives. In the first reading today, Job reflects upon such a life and in the Gospel we hear about Jesus ministering to people in their daily living.

There is something great about being a Christian; we are called to be human and at the same time to think beyond our human experience - not just the drudgery of living and working, but finding God and making meaning of our journey. Today's readings from Job and Mark celebrate human existence and honour peoples' struggles in living, but also remind us of the healing presence of God through our faith community. In the second reading Paul reflects on his mission for all!

No matter what stage of life we are at, there are blessings and curses. Job's story resonates with some of the dark moments in our lives. We struggle with the question of human existence and suffering.

I hope having Christ in our lives help us to see things differently. In all ways it is liberating, not just about making meaning or having a purpose in our lives. It is like a jigsaw puzzle, the more we work together at it everything seems to come together and fit in. Even our dark side and our failures can be easily acknowledged and accepted because of the redemptive power of Christ. All will be well (Julian of Norwich).

Yet life has to be lived and it is a pilgrimage and a mystery, and we can never isolate events and compartmentalise our human journey. It was only through the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus that the disciples understood Jesus' words and deeds better. Our faith helps our journey to dialogue or to enter into the conversation of life like Job.

I have another little My CORNET snippet from the front garden of the parish house, this time not a man-made one, but it seems also as destructive as last week's story. The huge plane trees along Whitehorse Road shed leaves on and off all year, according to poor Eddie our gardener, who continually battles with keeping things neat and clean. Last week's extraordinary heat wave seems to have totally burnt and desiccated the leaves. When I arrived at work on Tuesday there was a thick solid carpet of leaves, so thick that you couldn't see the gutters—I've never seen them like that, even in the midst of autumn. We are very concerned about the trees, and whether they will survive or not, although I have seen them cope with some rather savage pruning in the past. They are indicative of how many of us have been feeling after the heat—tired, drained, listless. Hopefully the parish Mission will enliven us all, bringing with it some cooler weather. I was sitting around feeling sorry for myself because I'm weary and hot, and I opened the current copy of Kairos. It contained an article headed 'Zimbabwe's catastrophe', written by Sr Ivy Khoury from Caritas Australia's Africa Program. If we thought it's tough here, we don't really know we are alive. The people are starving, they have nothing, , they are ill and there are no medicines, there's no work, no school, the government is in chaos. It's total disaster, total tragedy. But these faithful people still pray, believing that God will bring them out of their suffering. They have much to teach us. A bucket of water might help our trees, a smile encourage tired spirits. What can we possibly do for the people of Zimbabwe? I'm open to
