

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

How is your Lent going? This is a question I posed to the parishioners of a parish in which I served as an Associate a number of years ago. I

mentioned to them in my homily the week before Lent began, that I was going to ask them this question each time I saw them after Mass on Sunday during Lent.

Interestingly enough a number of parishioners responded very positively and were appreciative of the reminder as they began their week. A few of the people beat me to the punch and asked me the question before I could ask them. I had to give them an honest answer.

There were some, however, who made sure to leave the church by a different door. I wasn't sure if they did this for any practical reason or if they were trying to avoid answering a question which may have placed a little guilt on them. Not everyone takes Lent seriously.

There are too many distractions that keep us from really focusing on the need for spiritual renewal, repentance, or conversion during this time of the year. These distractions can take many different forms. We don't abstain from meat on Friday because others around us do not and we are too weak to lead by example – we simply (and conveniently) "forget." We don't set aside time for prayer because there is too much happening in our lives or in our world that draws our attention. Things like the latest movie or the latest sports attraction, or whatever seems to whet our appetites at the time. We don't set aside time for the Sacrament of Penance because we don't really understand sin and the effects of sin in our lives – or maybe just don't believe it.

Many, many years ago different forms of prayer and fasting were obligatory for all Catholics. Back then every day during the 40 day season of Lent was a "fast" day. That meant we were permitted to eat only one large meal each day. That beats any diet I know – and not only did one become more physically fit, he or she became more spiritually fit.

Abstinence was required every Friday throughout

the year and also on the Ember Days which occurred four times during the year. During the Ember Days fasting and abstinence was required on the Wednesday and Saturday of that week as well as the Friday. You mean you had to fast and abstain on days throughout the year other than the prescribed days of Lent? Oh yes! And we did, too.

On Friday evenings the churches would be filled with parishioners for the Stations of the Cross. One had to stand in line for Confession on Saturday afternoon or evening. There was standing room only at some Masses on Sunday. Our weekends are too crowded today.

For some, these things are a reminder of what once was; for others this is somewhat of a revelation. In time, the Church felt that it was more important to allow each person to develop his or her own plan for prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. It took the heavy burden off of us. This meant that we were to take ownership of our spiritual growth and development; it was no longer imposed on us. Many people were grateful for this opportunity, but what happened? It's a question we each have to answer for ourselves. Will our answer make Lent different for us this year?

How is your Lent going?

BEYOND SUNDAY

I have given a great deal of thought about the pledge I want to make to the Beyond Sunday campaign. What drives my decision most comes from my own history of Catholic education and my hope for the future. I was fortunate to be able to attend a grade school that was staffed almost totally with religious Sisters. Their devotion to the Faith was flawless.

The most significant thing that I can remember is how consistent our religious education was. What helped, of course, was the reinforcement we received not only from our parents, but from all of our parishioners.

When I was ordained in 1976 I was assigned to a parish with a Catholic school. I remember the faculty being mostly lay persons at that time with about six Dominican Sisters on the faculty or in the administration of the school. I was impressed with the knowledge of their faith and with their conviction to live the Catholic faith. There were many things, however, that challenged much of what they were trying to convey and teach – very different than 20 years before.

Today, some 40 years after my ordination and 60+ years since my elementary and high school education, I find that the religious education in the Catholic schools, while facing a lot of challenges, still remains consistent with the teachings of the Church, and the teachers continue to be faithful in their call to bring the knowledge and practice of that faith to their students.

There has been a great transition in education over the past 60 or so years. But I believe that, not only our Archbishop, but also those who administer our schools, continue to strive to keep our children Alive in Christ. And they strive to do so even more today than ever before.

Everyone should have the opportunity to receive a Catholic education. It not only helps to perpetuate the Catholic faith, it also helps to prepare the children of today to be our next generation of leaders, both in the Church and in the world.

So, for these reasons I will make a significant pledge to Beyond Sunday. I will do so because I want to help the Archbishop in his vision for our Catholic schools; and I believe that both the present and the future of the Church will be strengthened by the success of this campaign and by our generosity and loyal support.

When invited to do so, please consider a sacrificial gift or pledge to the Beyond Sunday campaign. Let us take what we learn each week at Mass, beyond Sunday, and put it into practice through our charity and generosity.

(Genesis 15:7)


