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School Bus Safety Poster Contest

Eligibility

Any student enrolled in St. Charles Parish Public Schools from Kindergarten through 5th grade.

Poster Specifications

- Completed poster size must be 11"x17" or 12"x 18". Posters may be illustrated on the vertical or horizontal axis.
- > Designs should be submitted on quality tag, poster illustration board or heavy paper. Construction paper may be used but winning entries must be mounted on quality tag poster. Lamination is not permitted and will disqualify the poster.
- There is no limitation on the use and number of colors or type of media such as print, crayon, felt pen, etc. used on the poster design; however, wood, plastic, glass or metal should not be part of the poster. Collage materials should not be used. Glued on pieces will eliminate the poster.
- Lettering and Drawing: The poster design may incorporate freehand letters only. Stenciled, pre-printed, manufactured stick-on or press-on letters or tracings may not be used and will disqualify the poster. Lettering should be clearly legible, even if used as part of the poster design. Cut paper/stencils (freehand or pre-drawn stick-on stencils) are not permitted and will disqualify the poster.
- Poster designs may not incorporate any copyrighted characters (i.e. comic and or television characters), photographs and magazine or newspaper illustrations.
- > Drawings must be original, correct in safety concept and the exclusive work of the student entering the contest in idea, design and execution. All artwork should be positive in approach, demonstrating only proper school bus safety behaviors. At least part of a yellow school bus must be present in the poster.
- The student's name, grade level, school and teacher's name must be attached to the back side of the poster.

Poster Theme:

Posters should represent the 2015 school bus safety campaign theme; "SCHOOL BUS SAFETY IS A TEAM EFFORT"

Posters:

Posters for the school contest must be given to Mrs. Edwards or Mrs. Perrin by September 8, 2015. The first place winner will be sent to the district level.

Judging

Criteria for the selection of award winning posters are:

- Relationship of the poster design to the school bus safety practices. (Safety Impact)
- o Originality of the poster and how the idea is expressed in the poster design. (Originality)
- Artwork and its execution. (Artistic Quality)
- Visual impact of the poster design. (Visual Impact)

Student Attendance Requirements

The St. Charles Parish Public School System would like to remind parents how important it is for their children to attend school each and every day.

In order for a student to receive grades and meet the promotional criteria at the end of the year, they must meet the following state requirements:

Elementary students must be in attendance a minimum of 167 days for the school year.

If a student should miss any days, we ask that parents remember to send in an excuse for each day the student was absent. As a reminder, the school year calendar consists of 177 instructional days. **Therefore, a student may not miss more than 10 days in the school year.**

Sick Children...Send to School or Keep Home?



<u>Go to school</u> - If your child has any of the following symptoms, they should probably go to school:

- Sniffles, a runny nose and/or a mild cough without a fever
- Vague complaints of aches, pains or fatigue
- Single episode of diarrhea or vomiting without any other symptoms
- Ear infection without fever. Your child does not need to be excluded, but does need medical treatment.

Please keep home if fever or pain is present.

Stay at home - If your child has any of the following symptoms, please keep your child home:

- <u>Fever</u>- temperature of 100.5 degrees Fahrenheit or higher. Remember that a child must be fever free (without the use of fever-reducing medication) for 24 hours before returning to school.
- <u>Eyes</u>- with thick mucus or pus draining from the eye or pink eye. With pink eye you may see a white or yellow discharge, matted eyelids after sleep, eye pain and/or redness. Your child must receive 24 hours of antibiotics and/or doctor approval before returning to school.
- <u>Sore Throat with fever or swollen glands in the neck</u>. Your child may return to school after 24 hours of antibiotic with strep throat.
- <u>Vomiting</u>- two (2) or more times within the past 24 hours.
- <u>Diarrhea</u>- three (3) or more watery stools in a 24-hour period, especially if the child acts or looks ill.
- Rash with fever or itching. Heat rashes and allergic reactions are not contagious.
- Lice, Scabies- children may not return to school until they have been treated and are free of lice.

If your child shows any of the above symptoms at school, it will be necessary to pick him/her up from school.

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Dress Code Information for 2015-16

St. Rose Elementary students will be allowed to wear **only green or white spirit shirts** to school in order to be consistent with the school colors designated by the St. Charles Parish Public School Dress Code Policy. In order to celebrate our school each day, **students will be allowed to wear spirit shirts every**

day of the week that are <u>green</u> or <u>white</u>. Don't forget that spirit shirts include student of the month shirts as well as themed shirts; therefore, students will not be able to wear any shirts from the past that are not green or white. Thank you for your cooperation with this matter. If you have any questions, please call St. Rose Elementary at 504-464-9254.

Official Dress Code Guidelines:

Shirt - collared white or hunter green shirt. (Elementary students may wear white or green official school spirit shirts).

Pants/Shorts - navy or khaki. Shorts - no shorter than 2 inches above the top of the kneecap. (Girls may also wear skirts, skorts, and jumpers.) (The uniform must be worn as two parts. If a khaki or navy dress is worn, a white or green shirt must be worn on top.)

As a guide, pants/shorts cannot be worn lower than 2 inches below the navel. If pants have belt loops, a belt must be worn.

Shirts must remain appropriately buttoned as determined by the administrator.

Reasonably sized logos/labels which are not distracting are permitted. **Pants must be solid navy or khaki with no trim or adornments.**

Pants (including capri), skirts, shorts, jumpers and skorts must be hemmed. Side slits above the knee are not permitted. **Cargo Pants are no longer permitted.**

Outerwear (jackets, coats, blazers, vests) that does not open the length of the front by snapping, buttoning or zipping is not allowed. White or school designated colored sweatshirts and pullover sweaters can be worn over the uniform. Reasonably sized logos/labels which are not distracting are permitted.

Only white or green colored shirts can be worn under a uniform shirt or jumper.

Footwear must have soles and restraints for the entire foot. (Backless shoes are not allowed.)

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Parent Portal

Attention all 3rd-5th grade parents...

Parent Portal allows you to view your child's grades 24 hours a day. You don't have to wait for a progress report to come home. Information on

assignments and attendance is available on a daily basis. Parent Portal passwords and user ID's can be picked up in the front office M-F between the hours of 9:00—4:00. Passwords and user ID's will only be issued to the parent/guardian, and you must present your picture ID when signing for the information. If you have not done so, we strongly encourage you to logon for up-to-date information on your child's

Sign in and Sign out Procedures

Anyone checking out a student must have the child's light green student ID card or a **picture ID** and be listed on the emergency card. Anyone signing in a student must bring the student to the school office specialist's desk and complete a tardy slip.

Bus Notes!!

Riding any bus other than the one assigned to you is not allowed without permission from the office.

If this is necessary, a **written note** must be sent from home requesting a bus change, and permission must be granted through the principal's office.

If it is extremely necessary to call requesting a bus change because of an EMERGENCY (ONLY), and an administrator must approve this.

All notes for bus or transportation changes must be given in writing prior to 2:30 p.m. each day. Notes should include your child's full name, the teacher's name, the student check out ID number, dates of the changes and a parent/guardian signature. Carpool Procedures!!

Carpool is offered every morning from 8:35-8:45



and afternoon from 3:35-3:45. We ask that all parents utilizing morning carpool wait until a staff member motions for the child to exit the vehicle. Please do not let the students out on your own. In the afternoon, cars will pull up 2 at a time and students will be brought to the vehicle. Please make sure your child is registered for afternoon carpool and that you have received a sign to display in your vehicle. Any child being picked up by someone other than who is listed on the emergency card, must have a note brought to the office. We also remind you that using your cell phone or smoking while in the carpool lanes is against the law.

Back to School: A Complete Checklist for Parents

The following are tips for getting back into the swing of things...

- ⇒ Put bedtime battles to rest. To help adjust to !INQUIRING MINDS WANT TO KNOW.... the new schedule, put your children to bed 10 minutes earlier each night. This will help eliminate the shock from a late to early bed time
- ⇒ Help get organized when it comes to schedules. There are many free apps and online organizations sites such as Got Family Get Organized, Evernote, and Remember the Milk.
- ⇒ Prepare for lots of paperwork. Help keep yourself and your student organized and current by checking schoolbags and folders daily. Make sure all important forms have been completed and returned on time.
- ⇒ Post your child's schedule and school calendar somewhere you can see.
- ⇒ **Volunteer your time or expertise**. Research shows that children whose parents are involved in their school do better academically and socially.
- ⇒ After school, let your child run inside and Instead of jumping straight to doing chores or homework, let your child have a much needed break. Spend 15 to 30 minutes connecting as a family: play a game, take a walk, talk about the day, and eat a snack.

Ofrezcan su tiempo. Estudios dicen que los niños que tienen padres que están involucrados en la escuela hacen mejor progreso académica y socialmente. Las maestras aprecian a los padres que están involucrados en la educación de sus hijos.

Después de la escuela deje que el niño juegue y descanse un rato. En vez de dar trabajo casero o hacer tareas, permitan que su hijo(a) tenga un rato de distracción .Compartan con su hijos unos 15 a 30 minutos a diario jugando, caminando, hablando de las experiencias del día comiendo.
