### WORLD RUGBY

A big Rugby weekend with internationals being played on four continents. All lower division games resumed in Europe after the European Six Nations concluded with Georgia retaining the Cup. *In the* only 1B division clash, Belgium and Poland met for a top of the table game in Brussels. Belgium crushed the pretenders, Poland, in an 8 try to 2, 53-23, romp.

There were two games played in the five team, 2A division, the leaders, Czech Republic, did not play. In Switzerland, the home side started shakily and came from behind to score 4 tries to 2 to beat Croatia, 40-20. For Croatia, former **West Harbour player, Jai Ayoub**, scored 15 of his team's points, a try, 2 penalties and 2 conversions. The other division game was to avoid bottom place. Israel hosted Malta. Each side scored two tries but the extra penaly goal saw Malta win, 16-13 in a match that did not attain great heights.

Similarly, in the 2C division, bottom placed Denmark had the weekend off. The two undefeated teams, Luxembourg and Slovenia met in Slovenia. It was a slug-fest with **three yellow cards** handed out but with its 2 tries to 1, Luxembourg held on wt triumph, 14-11. The other game was in Belgrade where Serbia scored 3 tries to beat Austria, 22-3. Both teams now have one win in the tournament.

In Asia, the revamped Asian Championship started. The top division now has only three teams, Japan, Korea and Hong Kong, instead of the previous five, due to the withdrawal of the major sponsor. Seoul was the opener venue with the home side, Korea playing out of its skin to only be behind 22-20, to Japan. In the second term Japan fired and asserted its superiority to finh off Korea, 56-30 with a 9 try to 3 scoresheet. After the match, Eddie Jones, Japan's coach, commented that Korea peaked for this game but Japan does not want to peak until the World Cup.

This week has seen Asia's 3 West division being played in Beirut. The first game saw hosts, Lebanon, score 9 tries to crush Jordan, 71-3. Two days later, Iran scored 8 tries to also beat Jordan with 49-3 score. The final between Lebanon and Iran was played last Saturday. Lebanon won 27-8 but no details of the encounter have come to hand.

This week has also seen the start of the South American championship, CONSURA in Montevideo. World Cup qualifiers, **Uruguay was too powerful** for the newly promoted, Paraguay and scored and easy 77-3 victory. The Teros followed this up with a comfortable win, 48-9, win over the quickly improving Brazil though this match did nothing to boost the teams confidence. Both games were held in Uruguay's capital, Montevideo.

The North America Caribbean Rugby Association (NACRA) championships also were played last weekend. This year, the teams are split into championship and cup divisions. The information has been sketchy but the results have been interesting. In the championship group, **Mexico continues its rise** through the ranks and had a satisfying 24-3 win over the Cayman Islands. The surprise was that NACRA's last year winner, Guyana, was beaten by the home team, Trinidad and Tobago. T&T led 12 nil at the break but Guyana could not bridge the gap in the second half which gave T&T a well earned 22-20 victory. Each side scored 4 tries.

The NACRA cup division, split into north and south zones for logistic purposes. The results to hand are Curacao 38 beat St Lucia 19, British Virgin Islands 22 beat St Vincent and the Grenadines 15 and Turks and Caicos Islands 24 beat Bahamas 7.


# **Rugby Connect – Trytons 2015**
