Next week is one of the most important weeks of the church calendar—"Holy Week". Holy Week begins with "Palm Sunday" where we remember Jesus riding into Jerusalem on a donkey. It continues through to "Maundy Thursday" where we remember Jesus' Last Supper, Good Friday when he suffered and died, and then Easter Sunday when he rose from the dead.

When Jesus was crucified, he was nailed to a cross between two rebels. One of them, in all his weakness, his sinfulness, his helplessness, called out to Jesus to save him, not from the death he would soon experience, but from eternal death. "Remember me"! Not just think about me, Jesus, but do something for me—rescue me, save me, help me. What a wonderful promise that Jesus speaks back to him—"Truly, I say to you"—I promise to you, I want you to be absolutely sure—"today you will be with me in Paradise."

Dear Jesus, I too am a sinner and you know my heart better than I know it myself. And yet, one drop of your blood is more powerful than all the sin in the world. Thank you for suffering and dying for me. Amen.

You are warmly invited to attend our Easter services this year at St Mark's to celebrate the death and resurrection of Jesus!



*3pm. Outdoor devotional service for the time of Jesus' death. (See notice below)


Easter Eve (4 April): 8pm. Candlelit Easter Vigil with bonfire (small one!) and Lord's Supper.

Schuhplattler - Dance Workshop

On Thursday 5th of March, Year 4 and 5 had a dance workshop of a different type. Reinhard Struve immigrated to Australia from Lower Saxony now member of the "Bund der Bayern inc.", gave the students an introduction to the Schuhplattler dance.



The "Schuhplattler" which is practised in Bavaria and Austria, is a partner dance. Through striking their thighs, knees and soles, clapping their hands and stamping their feet, the men try to impress the women which simultaneously displays the main goal of the dance.

After a first time of shyness, encouraged by Reinhard Struve, one could clearly see that the students enjoyed their immersion into a part of the Bavarian culture. Besides the dancing experience, they also learned about characteristic elements the Bavarian traditions contain. Cracking whips, the national costume and typical Bavarian music portray examples of it.

In summary, one can say that through the workshop, the students were able to collect intercultural experience which will help them to be open in upcoming, unfamiliar situations.
