ACADEMICS At EHCS, academic excellence begins in our VPK and elementary school and continues through high school, where students learn in classrooms with a low student-teacher ratio. They participate in academic pursuits such as the ACSI Spelling Bee; the Science Fair; and field trips to destinations such as the Navy base, the Florida Caverns, a corn maze, the Indian Temple Mound Museum, the zoo, the symphony, and the Saenger Theatre.



In the spring semester, several of our students qualified to participate in the county-wide History Fair. Two of our freshmen, Bryce Cox and Myles Herren, developed a history fair project on Hitchcock that won first place at EHCS, second at the Escambia County level and took first at the Florida History Fair in May. In June, Bryce and Myles exhibited their project — "E-E-E Enter the World of Alfred Hitchcock, the Master of Suspense and Horror Cinematography" — at the Smithsonian's National Museum of American History in Washington, D.C. as part of National History Day.

MISSIONS East Hill students focus on many other pursuits outside of the classroom as well. They take part in



missions at every age— Pennies for Paws, Ronald McDonald House, and Beads for Life, to name a few. Each year, our middle and high school students participate in the annual "One Day Without Shoes" event, which raises worldwide awareness of the need for shoes.
