

A Season for Growing...

From tulips and buds and bright green grass...to new garden beds out behind the church...to new faces in Bible study and worship: it's clear that this is the season for growing!

Some growth happens all by itself; it's enough simply to watch it happen and enjoy it. Other growth happens because people get involved in *making it happen*. A vision is shared, people show up with hammers and saws and paint brushes, rich soil and healthy seeds or plants. Yet another kind of growth (inward, faith-filled) takes place when people commit themselves to talk about the scriptures together, to worship and pray together as the Body of Christ in this place.




