# Cry out to God

When I see some of the things that happen in our world, I get angry. Each evening when I sit down to watch the news, technology ensures that I am confronted by graphic, live images of the day's events at home and overseas.

I watch the death and destruction of war. I see people hungry, displaced and sick, because of flood or famine. There are young people cut down in the prime of their lives through School massacres, drug overdoses and suicide. Families are torn apart by murder, abuse and tragedy. Then there is the senseless violence in our neighbourhoods, on the sporting arenas, and outside pubs and clubs.

In 2001 I remember waking up to the news and television pictures of the twin towers collapsing in New York. The devastation and horror as the images were played over and over left me shocked and bewildered. "This can't be happening!" "Is this real?" "Surely nobody would carry out such a terrible deed?" Deep within I was crying out, "Someone, do something!" "Let's Turn back time!" But, the event was real. It had happened. There was nothing I could do. I was helpless.

So, I cried out to the only one who could do something: "God, do something!" I think many people made similar cries on that fateful day and the days that followed.

That's how the prophet Isaiah felt in our first reading. He witnessed Israel decline politically and religiously. God called Israel to be a holy nation, but they got themselves into a mess. They worshipped idols. They committed acts of injustice and hatred towards one another. They were oblivious to the presence of God in their lives. But Isaiah remembered God's faithfulness and mighty deeds from the past. God had brought the people out of captivity. God had saved them.

So. Isaiah turned to God and pleaded, "Return, for the sake of your servants, the tribes of your inheritance. Oh, that you would tear the heavens open and come down." Isaiah realised that it was only God who could turn things around. Isaiah appealed to God to do something! To come down and make things right again. Today we begin the season of Advent which means "coming". Christmas is coming, but we remember also that Christ is coming. When Jesus cane to Bethlehem, that was God's answer to Isaiah's prayer. By sending Jesus, God tore open heaven and personally came to make things right. Jesus then set about healing the sick, loving the unloved, eating with sinners, and bringing good news to the poor and oppressed. In our time, when we see the pain of society, let's not give up or become disheartened. Remember that Jesus came to do something about it.


This Advent, let your voice cry out to God to make things right. God did it for Isaiah and we celebrate that fact every year. The promise is that God will also do it for us.

### **ADVENT**

The season of Advent is the beginning of the Church's liturgical year. The Church's liturgical year follows a three-year cycle and we move today into the second of these, Year B. The Gospel readings for this year come predominantly from the gospel of Mark. Advent is a four week season of preparation for Christmas. During this time we reflect on the coming of Christ into human history as a small baby, the coming of Christ at the end of time and the coming of Christ into our own lives each day. The lighting of the Advent wreath candles symbolise our own reflective journey to recognise the coming of Christ as our Light. The gospel of the first Sunday of Advent invites us to stay awake! Waiting for the Lord's coming is the dominant symbolic activity of Advent, a waiting not with fear, but a waiting with patience and hope spent in preparation and reflection. Advent can be a time of longing for God's action in the world to be realized through our readiness to do good for others.
