### **BROKEN BAY DIOCESE RUGBY UNION TRIALS 8 May 2015**

- Broken Bay Sports Council will conduct trials to select students to be invited to attend the Polding Area Rugby Union Trials.
- The purpose of the Polding Area Trials is to select an open age team to compete at the NSW PSSA State Rugby Union Carnival (to be held in Sydney 18-20 August).
- It is important to note that these trials are for children who display an above average ability in the sport.
- The ARU imposes restrictions on the age range that may compete in the same team /competition. For 2015, only students born in 2003 and 2004 (i.e. aged 11or 12 years in 2014) are permitted to attend the Broken Bay or Polding trials.
- A school may not send more than 5 students to the trial without prior permission from the Primary Sport Coordinator.

#### School Sport Coordinators are required to do the following:

- Inform students in year 5 and 6, born in 2003 or 2004 of the Broken Bay Rugby Trials
- Advertise in the school newsletter that the school will be selecting students invited to attend the trials and that all gueries should be directed to the school sport coordinator
- Distribute the Parent's Information/Trial Details and Player Profile Nomination forms to suitable experienced/skilled children who meet the age criteria
- Select suitably skilled students who meet the age criteria to attend the trials. Do not send more than 5 students
- Email a list of all students from your school who will be attending rugby trials to <u>iulie-ann.thompson@dbb.edu.au</u> by Tuesday 5 May (week 3). This list will be used to record attendance.
- Collect and sign the 'Nomination/Player Profile' forms. Fax or email these forms to the <u>convener for</u> the particular sport as listed on the parent information note at least two working days before the day of the trial (do not send them to me).

#### Parents need to be made aware of the following information:

- Students may only attend the Broken Bay trials with the permission of their school.
- Age group restrictions (born 2003 and 2004) mandated by the ARU apply for rugby union.
- Parents are responsible for all transport and supervision arrangement for their own children attending Broken Bay team trials and are required to remain at the rugby trials with their child.
- The selectors' decisions are final.
- Attendance at training, if requested, is compulsory.
- Parents of children selected to participate in Polding Winter Team Sport Trials must make their own transport and accommodation arrangements for their children.
- All enquiries should be directed to the school sport coordinator.
  - In the event of wet weather and need for the trials to be postponed, students will be advised via their school. A message will also be recorded on 82507976.

Broken Bay Diocese selection trials for children wishing to be considered to participate at the Polding Area Rugby Union Trials will be held on 8th May.

Age restrictions apply to rugby union (as stipulated by the ARU) and only students born in 2004 or 2003 will be permitted to trial. The selectors are looking for children who display an outstanding ability at the particular sport.

 In the case of <u>wet weather</u>, schools will be notified of any changes. A recorded message will be available on 82507976

#### Please note the following:

- 'Player Profile Nomination' forms must be returned to school sport coordinator at least 7 working days prior to the trials so they may be sent to the sport conveners. Students must have the school's permission to participate in the trials. A school has the right to refuse permission for a student to attend the Broken Bay trials.
- The background information on the 'nomination form' is not used for 'pre-selection' but assists the school in selecting students for the trial and assists the conveners in organising the children at the trial.
- Parents are responsible for all transport and supervision arrangements for their children attending Broken Bay team trials **and** Polding trials. Parents are required to remain present at the trials.
- Attendance at any training days is compulsory. The team manager will advise of these details if applicable. Exceptions will not be made for children who are unable to attend because of commitments to another representative team. They will have to choose whether they are able to make a commitment to the Broken Bay squad.
- The selector's decisions are final.
- Clothing: children are required to wear their school sport uniform or other appropriate sports attire
  including protective equipment as prescribed for the sport.
- It is compulsory for a mouth guard to be worn while playing and participating in training drills. Head gear is strongly recommended.
