GCIA 2011 - FAQs

1. What subjects / modules are covered in this programme?

- a) Principles of Contract, Tort and Evidence (CTE);
- b) Arbitration Law and Practice (ALP);
- c) Drafting and Award Writing Practicum (DAW).

2. What is the Drafting and Award Writing Practicum?

The DAW Practicum is an intensive, interactive assessment which involves role play, drafting exercises and a final award writing examination.

3. If I am accepted on to this course, when will I receive the offer letter?

You should receive an offer letter by 29 November 2010.

4. What is the duration of the course?

This course is conducted over a university semester. Teaching will commence in the first week of January and will end within May.

5. When will the exams be held?

In May 2011.

6. What are the admission requirements?

A good bachelor's degree from a recognized university.

7. Is there an age requirement or limit?

Not as such, but priority will be given to applicants over the age of 35 – the reason being that this is the required minimum age for Fellowship with the Singapore Institute of Arbitrators and the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators.

8. How much is the course fee?

SGD6,000 (plus GST).

9. What is the mode of payment? May payment be made by instalments?

Payment is to be made by cheque. Payment by instalments is not permitted.

10. How do I apply?

Please click <u>here</u> to download the application form.

11. Is there a supplementary examination if I fail any of the modules?

There are no supplementary examinations.

12. Will I be allowed an opportunity to retake any failed module?

You will be allowed one opportunity to retake any failed module the following year on payment of the entire course fee which is applicable for that year.

13. Do I need to make the payment together with the application form?

Yes. You are invited to submit your application form, together with the course fee. In the event that you are not selected for the course, we will return your cheque. Offer letters will only be given to those who have tendered the full course fee.

14. What is the class size?

It is strictly limited to 30 students (including any re-takers). This is to ensure that an appropriate tutor / student ratio is maintained (which is especially important for DAW), and to satisfy the requirements of the accrediting professional institutions.

15. Will I be given a full set of materials for the course?

Yes. The materials will be disseminated through students' mailboxes.

16. Are there tutorials?

No, but (as with previous GCIA classes) students are encouraged to organise for themselves peer discussion and revision groups.

17. Will I be required to use one of the University's computers to complete my Award writing examination?

Yes, all students are required to draft their Award using the computers which are made available by the University. For reasons relating to the integrity and security of the examination, no personal laptops or thumb drives (or any similar devices) are to be used at any time during the exam, and the use of any existing soft copy template, etc (whether via the Internet or otherwise) is strictly prohibited.

18. Can special arrangements be made for taking the examinations if I suffer from a disability?

Yes, but strictly in accordance with the University's guidelines.

19. Can I seek a review of my examination results if I am unhappy with them?

Yes, but strictly in accordance with the University's guidelines.

20. What is the closing date for application?

15 November 2010.

21. If, for any reason, I am unable to sit one or more of the examinations and complete the course, will I be entitled to a refund of the whole or any part of the course fee?

No.

Further, you will not be allowed to defer your attendance and complete the course the following year without paying the entire course fee which is applicable for that year.

22. Does the GCIA allow me to hold myself out as a qualified Arbitrator?

No. Nevertheless, the GCIA is a significant first step towards such qualification and recognition.

23. How can I qualify as a Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators in London (CIArb)?

While successful GCIA candidates are exempted from taking CIArb's own examinations, its other requirements such as passing an Interview must still be met. Since these requirements change from time to time, you should check the current position directly with CIArb.

24. Can I qualify as a Fellow of the Singapore Institute of Arbitrators (SIArb) once I have obtained the Graduate Certificate in International Arbitration?

Yes. GCIA is fully recognised by SIArb. Upon graduation, you may apply for Fellowship with that institution.

25. Will there be a graduation ceremony?

Yes. This is usually held in or around September each year.
