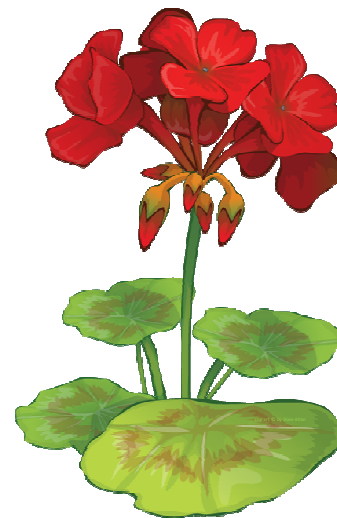


David Retallick

David Retallick was born and raised on a mixed farm near Millbrook Ontario. Gardening has been a huge part of his life. David had a great mentor in his grandmother who showed him how to grow food in clay soil. That was the start of David's gardening journey that has taken many directions over the years.

David owns a garden maintenance company called "**David's Garden Service**" which allows him the pleasure of keeping other peoples garden beds in top condition from spring to fall.

David has been hybridizing daylilies for 15 years now and has 13 registrations with the American Hemerocallus Society with more new ones in 2014. He has around 180 named varieties for sale in July and August. David has been developing his own type of daylilies that bloom long and have high bud counts. Naming these beauties is done by having a story to go with everyone. Even the grandchildren get ones named for them. David has his own way of breeding and growing daylilies that work very well.



He also grows about 75 varieties of TRUE LILIES as the fragrance of some is definitely intoxicating, can't be without smell in the garden. Please visit his farm, see what he has, enjoy the colour and the view. You can't miss the farm; it's the one on Highway 28 with the 8 foot **E+R** letters on the front bank.

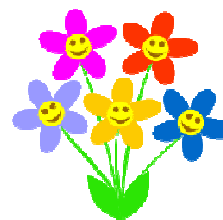

March Garden Tasks . . .

- ◆ Start tomatoes indoors (late March early April).
- ◆ Order summer-flowering bulbs.
- ◆ Prune summer-flowering shrubs (e.g. Hydrangea)
- ◆ Start summer flowers and tender perennials (tuberous begonias, cannas, callas and caladiums in pots).
- ◆ Apply dormant spray to fruit trees and pest-prone shrubs (non-freezing temperatures, before buds open).
- ◆ Loosen packed mulch and press back frost heaved perennials.
- ◆ Cut some spring flowering shrub branches for forcing inside.
- ◆ Plant flower and vegetable seeds indoors.
- ◆ Prune grapevines.

District 4 of the Ontario Horticultural Association is pleased to send out an invitation to all horticultural and agricultural members in Ontario to join them for a **Judging School course**.

The course outline includes 5 segments. It has been decided that the first of these five segments will be held in September of 2014 in the Peterborough area. The following four segments will be held in the spring of 2015 and fall of 2016. Each segment is to be 2 consecutive days held on a weekend.

In order to proceed with the planning we need to know many people are interested in attending so we can select the correct size of facility.
