#### 2 – Harbor View Highlights February 2013

If only our foresight was as clear as our hindsight, what a difference it would make! I've been thinking about a lot lately. While I can make no claims to see what God has set before us on the horizon, I can join with you in looking back over our collective shoulder and see what God has done, and mark some of the accomplishments toward which we can point and rejoice.

2012 was a very full year! From my vantage point, I can see worship services during which the Spirit of Christ was at work, stirring hearts and drawing us into His presence. We saw the chancel choir and music team growing as new voices joined in song to honor God. Sunday school classes



(discipleship groups) met, in which small group interaction gave those who attended deeper roots into God's Word. A new adult class was added so that the choir members might have a chance to do some spiritual work and be nurtured in faith. Overall attendance during Sunday school was proportionally greater than in previous years. The youth group made a major decision - to plan a mission trip to Guatemala, and to work together to fund that outreach. The exterior of the building was painted, as well as some of the interior hallways, and the kitchen in fellowship hall. A bathroom was overhauled, updated, and is now accessible to anyone; new signs placed around the front of the church; a new hot water heater was installed in the kitchen; new banners were added to the sanctuary to aid in worship; and our first stained glass window was installed. Reflect and consider all the years during which those windows were discussed, money given, and ideas shared. Today they are finally a reality! New members have come to join the church family, and more are on the way. The congregation gathered to add their insights and ideas into the development of a new vision statement. It was truly wonderful to see so many come together with an enthusiasm to share their thoughts and give prayerful consideration to the future of Harbor View. Out of that event, the vision team fashioned and the session adopted the new vision statement. Members of the church participated in a new Habitat for Humanity project with members of other churches. The Ramp Team was given new materials for the work on wheelchair ramps – aluminum premade sections, making them a bit easier and less timeconsuming to install. The ECEP added new classes, more children, and more teachers to an already robust program, increasing the opportunity to touch families with the care of Christ. During a year that was very hard on many families, HVPC was able to assist an unprecedented number of people in financial distress through the loose offerings collected at communion services. A car was donated and members of the church made that gift possible to a member in need. We have beloved members who were diagnosed with life –threatening and life-altering conditions more than a year ago, who, by the grace of Christ, remain among us. In these ways and more, the goodness of the Lord has been poured out upon us and continues to overflow to our hearts with thanksgiving.

No doubt, as you review 2012, you will have additions to make to that list! We truly have much to celebrate, as we move into this year together. 2013 will be "The Year of Living the Vision: Focus on Fellowship and Outreach." Those two dimensions of church life reflect the first two clauses of the Vision Statement: "Harbor View Presbyterian Church is a community of faith, seeking to transform the world...." Not only this, but these two aspects of congregational life must be held in constant balance. Too much emphasis on one will lead to a distortion of the other. Too much fellowship and not enough outreach leads to a narcissistic church that cares about itself to the neglect of the Great Commission. Too much outreach and not enough fellowship deplete the congregation of its spiritual strength and may lead us to lose sight of the reason/basis for why we reach out. On a biblical level, these two foundational purposes of church life are reflected in the New Testament words disciple and apostle. A disciple gathers with other disciples and with the master to learn and develop understanding. Linguistically, a disciple is literally a "learner." An apostle is the person who has learned and is ready to go out and share what he/she has learned. The literal translation of apostle is "sent-out-one." Thus, discipleship and apostleship share much in common with the understanding of fellowship and outreach. We gather in fellowship – not for fellowship's sake alone – but to grow and develop as disciples of Jesus Christ. And then, like the disciples of Scripture, having learned, we are sent out as apostles into the world.

Disciples and apostles - - we are called to be both! That's part of our Christian identity. They describe and reflect the essentials of fellowship and outreach. Let us grow and develop these integral areas of our congregational life! We want everyone to join us in that process as we gather on **Sunday Feb. 17 at 4pm** for another **Vision Event**. This event will be focused on fellowship. We will begin in the gym, with some fun activities to engage us all in some interactive fellowship. There will be a nursery for all who need to make use of that service. Food will be available for all who would like to partake of some afternoon snacks and refreshments. From the gym, we will break into small groups for some more interaction and discussion. #### A BIBLICAL STUDY OF MARRIAGE

(in a continuing series)

Jeremiah 3:1-14 and several other texts of the Old Testament evoke at a strong parallel between the commandments forbidding idolatry and those prohibiting adultery. Promiscuity goes hand in hand with a religious laxity that is willing to worship any number of false gods. In other words, infidelity to God is referenced in the Hebrew Scriptures in terms of marital infidelity. On the other hand, monogamy goes with monotheism. Exclusive devotion to the one true God is correlated to exclusive fidelity to one's spouse. God's covenant with Israel is like a monogamous marriage. The zealous, jealous love of the human relationship finds its match in the zealous, jealous love of the divine. This metaphor is the lens through which traditional Jewish interpreters saw the Song of Solomon. In a poetic image of intercourse, the bride says of her bridegroom:

"My beloved has gone down to his garden, to the beds of spices, to pasture his flock in the gardens, and to gather lilies. I am my beloveds and my beloved is mine; he pastures his flock among the lilies." (Song of Solomon 6:2-3)

The poet praises this "love [that] is strong as death, passion fierce as the grave" (8:6). The immediate reference is

to the overwhelming passion between a bride and bridegroom. Figuratively, however, later Jewish and Christian interpreters saw a portrayal of the allconsuming love between God and his people. The metaphor comes to life in the prophecy of Hosea. God asks the prophet to "take for yourself a wife of prostitution and have children of prostitution" as a living illustration of how "the land commits great prostitution by forsaking the LORD" (Hosea 1:2). Hosea's wife, Gomer, goes after other lovers; however, God (and Hosea, too) persists: "Therefore, I will now allure her, and bring her into the wilderness, and speak tenderly to her" (2:14). In a moving act of determined love, Hosea buys Gomer back out of prostitution, as God will redeem Israel from its infidelity. The promise in both cases is that "I will take you for my wife forever; I will take you for my wife in righteousness and in justice, in steadfast love, and in mercy" (2:19).

It is hard to imagine a more vivid depiction of God's unconditional, enduring love for Israel. The implication, too, is that human marital love should have similar qualities, always ready to seek forgiveness and reconciliation with the spouse to whom one has pledged, whenever possible.
