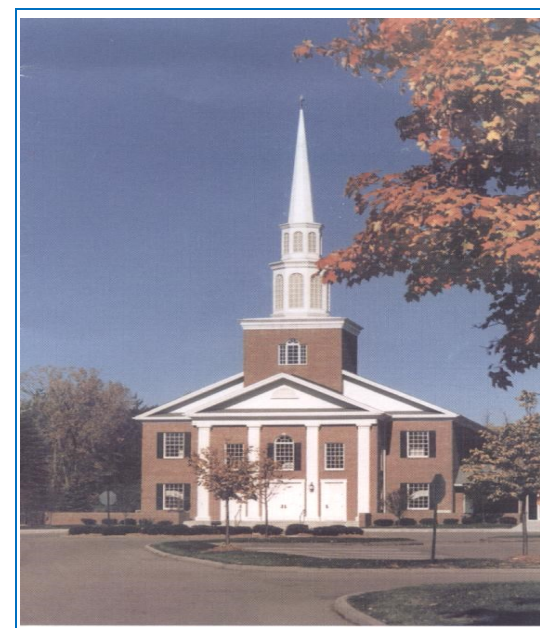

From the Minister...



It has seemed that this winter will never end! The grey days, the snow and ice have distracted me from the reality that the days are getting longer, the sun's rays are getting warmer, and no matter how remote it seems, Spring will come. This is the truth of our faith as well: in the midst of darkness and despair, resurrection bursts upon us. At no time is this more apparent than in the season of Lent, beginning March 5th, when we reflect on Jesus' life, teachings, and death, culminating in Easter (April 20), when we celebrate Christ's Resurrection and all of the resurrections that God is working in our world and in our lives.

This year, our Lenten study will stretch across weekdays and Sundays, in a series I'm calling "Red Letter Jesus." We will look in the Gospel of Matthew at Jesus' own words, the ones often printed in red in copies of the Bible, and consider what he had to say about how to live and how to love. Weekday sessions, open to everyone, will offer the same lesson on Tuesday mornings at 10 and Wednesday evenings at 7:15 (a supper is available on Wednesdays at 6:30 p.m.). Sunday's worship services will feature additional passages. They are listed in the Lenten brochure in this newsletter. I hope you'll find yourself able to attend both times each week, to gain the greatest benefit from studying scripture this Lent! I always look forward to hearing the thoughts and ideas that emerge from discussions about the Bible, and as people who are committed to being "followers of Jesus," our discipleship will be opened up to new possibilities as we spend time thinking about the things that Jesus has taught us.

Looking forward to seeing many of you on Ash Wednesday, as we receive ashes and begin our Lenten journey,

Is it still winter? This has been an exciting one. But even with canceled meetings/rehearsals, extra snowplows, and burst pipes, the work of our church has continued.

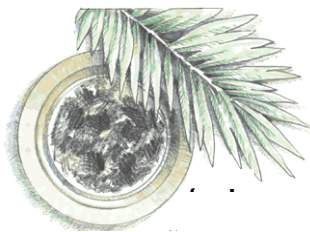
What's Been Happening at North Church this Winter?

This novel is set in present day Appalachia and explores how the complexities we inevitably encounter in life lead us to believe in our particular chosen truths. At the center of the story is a young wife and mother on a failing farm in rural Tennessee who experiences something she cannot explain. What follows shows how her discovery energizes various competing factions—religious leaders, climate scientists, environmentalists, politicians—trapping her in the center of a conflict about meaning, and ultimately opening up her world.

Every year, North Church joins with other faith communities and organizations to participate in the Farmington/Farmington Hills/West Bloomfield CROP Hunger Walk. Each year, our community Walk brings in over \$35,000; of that, 25% is returned directly to hunger relief projects in our own community. The remainder of the money goes around the U.S., and around the world, to provide emergency food, to improve the ability of people to produce their own food, and to make clean, safe water available for people, farm animals, and crops.

YOU CAN HELP! We need walkers, to get pledges and donations for walking the 10K or 2 mile routes; we need volunteers on Walk Day, May 4th, in the afternoon, and we need lots of people to help get ready for the Walk. Information and pledge forms will go out in Coffee Hour in late March. If you would like to volunteer to staff the information table, or to make phone calls and help distribute materials to walkers, please speak with **Rev. Mimi Biedron** who has chaired the community walk for the past 14 years.
