

Statutory Declaration

Authorised Witnesses

In accordance with the *Oaths Act 1936*, any of the following persons may witness the signing of a statutory declaration within South Australia;

- a Justice of the Peace
- a Notary Public of South Australia, the Commonwealth or another State
- a **proclaimed** member of the South Australian Police Force (found at most South Australian police stations)
- a Commissioner for Affidavits includes
 - Judge or Master of the Supreme Court
 - Judge or Master of the District Court
 - all Magistrates
 - Registrars and Deputy Registrars of the Supreme Court, Districts Court, Industrial Relations Court, Youth Court and the Magistrates Court
 - any legal practitioner listed on the roll of practitioners of the Supreme Court of South Australia
 - any other person appointed by the Governor to be Commissioners for taking Affidavits in the Supreme Court.

WARNING

It is a criminal offence to provide a false declaration. Where Care Park has evidence that indicates the content of a statutory declaration is untrue, it is company policy to **refer the matter to police for investigation and prosecution.**
