

Cell Block Seven is a California jazz band favoring the West Coast traditional jazz sound of **Lu Watters**, **Turk Murphy** and the **Bay City Jazz Band** of the '50s in a classic jazz lineup led by two cornets.

Their many festivals, tours, and concert successes are a direct result of their very professional approach coupled with a great sound and an extensive repertoire.

As with most bands, the lineup has changed somewhat over the years, but most members of the present team have been together for 10 years or more.

Cell Block Seven is a very versatile and entertaining band. By doubling their talents on the double bell euphoniums, Cell Block Seven is able to produce some very different sounds – from fast, exciting trios to smooth and mellow blues – all in great low brass harmony.
