From The Pastor

We are blessed to have beautiful banners for each season of the church year (Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter, Pentecost) displayed in our sanctuary. They were created by our former Minister of Youth & Families, **Rev. Brooke (Hubbs) Hilliard**. In the seasons of Lent and Easter, we see in the two banners the power of the cross.



On the Lenten banner, the cross is a collage of small crosses made from various fabrics in shades of grey, purple and black. Its somber colors are meant to inspire self-reflection, an awareness of our own sin, and the depth of suffering and sacrifice Jesus endured on the cross. The small crosses are reminders that Jesus died for each one of us, yet they form one large cross because Jesus is the Savior of *all* of humanity.

Then, on Resurrection Sunday, the banner is transformed. On a white cloth canvas, the cross is now a collage of bright, colorful butterflies! The cross on which Christ died is the cross through which we find new life.

We are free from our sin and reconciled with God. And He not only conquered sin, but also conquered death itself when he rose from the dead. The cross is no longer only a symbol of death, but is also a symbol of life. Through faith in him, we have a new beginning, a new hope, a new perspective, a new life entirely. In First Peter it says, "Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead!"



I invite you in these Lent and Easter seasons to join me in reflecting on the power of the cross and rejoicing in the promise of the empty tomb upon your life.

Holy Week Schedule

Passion/Palm Sunday, April 17, 10:30 A.M. New Life UMC—Celebrating Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, and the events that would ultimately lead to his crucifixion.

Holy Thursday, April 21, 7:00 P.M. New Life UMC—Traditionally called Maundy Thursday after the Latin word "mandatum" referring to Jesus' new commandment to love one another. In a drama entitled "Another Supper" we will hear the witnesses of 12 women whose lives were changed by their encounters with Jesus. We will then celebrate Holy Communion. Women from both King Avenue and New Life UM Churches, as well as the combined choirs, will share in the leadership of the service.

TWO ways to Donate to New Life's Ministries via www.newlifeunitedmethodist.org

New Life UMC is now accepting online donations in two different ways. These are through the Columbus Foundation's PowerPhilanthropy (where a donor can view our portrait and make donations online) and through PayPal (using a credit card or a direct bank transfer).

A donor who chooses to give direct transfer from a bank to PayPal will not be charged any fee, nor will the church, for that transfer. If a donor chooses the PayPal credit card option there will be a 2.2% +\$0.30 per transaction. However, the direct transfer option will require the donor to either have, or setup, a PayPal account.

A donor who chooses the Columbus Foundation option will be asked to use a credit card and will be charged a fee of 3.3%, which will be deducted from each donation. The balance will be sent to the church.

Within either option there is the opportunity for the donor to direct the donation to a particular fund or ministry at the church.

Money from either option will be transferred directly from the donor's chosen source to the church's checking account.

Annual Conference Delegate Needed

The West Ohio Annual Conference will be held at Lakeside, Ohio **June 6 through June 9**. During this time, pastors and lay people will discuss, debate and vote on resolutions regarding social issues, programs in the local churches, and business and financial matters; worship together and learn from key speakers; celebrate the commissioning and ordination of deacons and elders; fellowship together and enjoy beautiful Lake Erie.

Each local church is to have a lay delegate for each appointed pastor. That means we can send one person from our congregation. If you are interested in representing New Life by serving as a lay delegate, please speak with Pastor Jennifer as soon as possible. Please know that you are expected to cover all but \$150 of your expenses (housing and meals).

Easter on Fifth Lenten Mission Project

It has become a tradition to be in mutual mission with Trinity United Methodist Church each Lenten Season by raising funds to purchase new blankets, sheets, pillows, queen size sheets for 100 beds, and 50 sleeping bags. They will then be distributed to our neighbors through the Clothing Room throughout the year. **Donations of \$50 will purchase a complete queen size set, or 2 sleeping bags. 
