AAC I.D. CARDS AND MEASURING

If your dog does not have an AAC ID Card please order it yourself before the trial. All dogs must have an AAC ID card number to compete in this trial. The ID card application is available on the AAC website at www.aac.ca. Measuring for dogs that do not have completed AAC ID cards will be available on both days starting at 7:30 AM. While Dogs at Large will no longer check completed ID Cards at a formal check-in, please note that Dogs at Large and/or the Judge may review the ID Card if deemed necessary.

CLASS CHANGES

A dog that has entered a trial and subsequently earns a title shall be permitted to move up in that class, as long as the trial secretary is notified outside of one-week before the date of the trial. If you do not contact the trial secretary, you will not be permitted to move up on the day of the trial.

AGILITY CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Standard Classes

These classes are open to all dogs, 18 months of age or older, as described within the current AAC rules.

Special Classes

These classes are open to all dogs but are intended for dogs that are of a size or stature that limits there jumping ability. A dog may no longer compete in Regular classes after being entered at an official trial in any Special class except that they may move to Veterans.

Veterans Classes

These classes are for dogs seven years of age or older that are currently competing in any Standard Agility Class and for dogs five years of age or older who have competed in the Specials Agility Class for a minimum of one calendar year.

Junior Handlers

Dogs at Large is pleased to offer junior handlers classes. The AAC has expanded the Junior Handlers program to allow juniors to run in and earn qualifying scores in all classes, including games. Juniors will have veteran times and may run at a height lower than that at which the dog normally competes, and can accumulate their qualifying scores with different dogs.

Starters Standard Class

The Starters Class is for dogs not having earned the Agility Dog of Canada (ADC) title. Dogs completing three (3) clear rounds of Starters Standard, as defined by the AAC Rules and Regulations, shall be awarded the ADC title.

Starters Games Classes

The Starters Games Classes are for dogs that have not completed two clear rounds in that particular game scored by two different judges.

Advanced Games Classes

The Advanced Games Classes are for dogs that have not completed three clear rounds in that particular game scored by two different judges.

Steeplechase

The Steeplechase class is **open to all dogs** eligible to compete in AAC events at any level and demonstrates the dog's ability to run and jump at speeds while maintaining control on the A-frame and weave poles.

FOOD SERVICES

DIRECTIONS

The Alberta Shutzhund Association site is at the extreme SE end of the city, out in the country but within city limits.

Take Anthony Henday to the 50th Street exit south. Go south on 50th St to Ellerslie Rd. Turn left (going east) on Ellerslie Rd. and take your next right onto 34th St. Continue south on 34th St for 3 more kilometres. The Alberta Schutzhund Association is on the right hand side (you'll see CHED radio towers in the field). There is an ASA sign beside the dirt driveway with a picture of a German Shepherd on it.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

Exhibitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of the rules and regulations of the AAC, including but not limited to the following:

This event is held under AAC Rules and Regulations and is open to all dogs being at least 18 months of age, pure breed or mixed breed, except bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance.

Obstacles shall be chosen from those described in the current edition of the rules and regulations of the AAC and shall conform to AAC specification.

No leads, collars, food, toys or any other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course at any time.

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and / or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and / or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may be asked to leave the show grounds and NO REFUND of fees shall be given.

All dogs must be penned, crated or attended on leash when not in the ring. All dogs must be under control when exiting the ring. Any dog engaging in aggressive or out of control behavior upon exit of the ring may be disqualified and / or required to leave the show grounds and NO REFUND of fees shall be given.

Exhibitors MUST keep crate and exercise areas clean. Please clean up after yourselves and your dogs. Anyone who does not clean up after themselves or their dogs may be required to leave the show grounds and no refund will be given.

Refunds, cancellations or changes after the closing date, will be subject to a \$10 administration fee (except for bitches in season or injured dogs with a certificate from a veterinarian) providing the trial secretary is informed prior to the trial date.

Please be advised that a break-away tire will be used at this trial.
