Lent is a period of 40 days, excluding Sundays, in which we prepare our hearts and minds to experience, once again, the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is characterized by the practice of spiritual disciplines, such as prayer, fasting, meditation, study and worship. The season of Lent began on Ash Wednesday with a service of reflecting upon the necessity of changing one's life. Lent culminates this year during Holy Week, April 17—April 24 as we move through Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, the sting of his betrayal on Maundy Thursday, his execution on Good Friday, and the glory of his resurrection on Easter Sunday.



Please plan to attend a *Mardi Gras Dinner on Ash Wednesday*, March 9! This celebration of life begins in Memorial Hall, at 5:30 PM, and continues with a ceremonial "removal of the beads" as we move to the worship service in the sanctuary and transition into a

mood of Lenten reflection. Tickets for the Mardi Gras Dinner are: \$5 per person; \$10 per couple; and \$15 per family (3 or more.) The ticket price includes your New Orleans-style jambalaya dinner and dessert, a "faux-Hurricane" drink and your Mardi Gras beads. # A Message from Pastor Jeanne

## Change Without Fear

One of my favorite old hymns is by Anna Waring.

*In heavenly love abiding, no change my heart shall fear;  
And safe is such confiding, for nothing changes here.  
The storm may roar without me, my heart may low be laid,  
But God is round about me, and can I be dismayed?*



This hymn is a reminder to me that we are safe in the midst of change, and can face whatever is at hand with fearlessness and faith. No matter what happens, God is ever-present and always in control. As our little church goes through this season of discernment and decision-making, what better assurance could we have than that? And as God's timing would have it, we're also entering the season of Lent where traditionally we give up something that threatens to be an addiction or idol in order to follow Christ in surrendering to God's will.

The challenge that Jesus gives us is to surrender our own self-interests. Give the shirt off your back, and your coat, too. Take no thought for your life. Sell what you have and give to the poor. Serve those who are undervalued. We are blessed if we are merciful, meek, pure in heart and peacemakers. In this way, we become perfected in Christ, praying with Jesus that we "may all be one," which is the quote on the UCC logo.

This kind of unity is only possible through prayer and grace, through which we gain the humility to silence our pride that seeks our own interests. Christ's truth recognizes the sacredness of each person. With reverence and deference to one another, we see our oneness in Christ. That kind of change in perspective is a real challenge for our self-centered egos, which is why it's so important that our love for God be first, above all else. The second verse of the old hymn says:

*Wherever he may guide me, no want shall turn me back;  
My Shepherd is beside me and nothing can I lack.  
His wisdom ever waketh, his sight is never dim.  
He knows the way he taketh and I will walk with him.*

Brothers and sisters, let's walk together through this season of Lent as one, as Jesus prayed we would be. The Lenten season begins with Ash Wednesday on March 9<sup>th</sup>, at 7 PM, in collaboration with Community Church of Barrington and Salem United Methodist (that they may all be one!).

The Sunday sermons for Lent follow the theme of "The Character and Qualities of Jesus."

March 13: Courage                      April 3: Compassion  
March 20: Faith                         April 10: Obedience  
March 27: Integrity                    April 17: (Palm Sunday) Forgiveness

The final verse of the hymn is God's promise to provide exactly what we need – individually, and as a body of Christ, now and forever. Certainly God is good *all* the time!

*Green pastures are before me, which yet I have not seen:  
Bright skies will soon be o'er me, where darkest clouds have been.  
My hope I cannot measure, my path in life is free.  
My Savior has my treasure, and he will walk with me.*

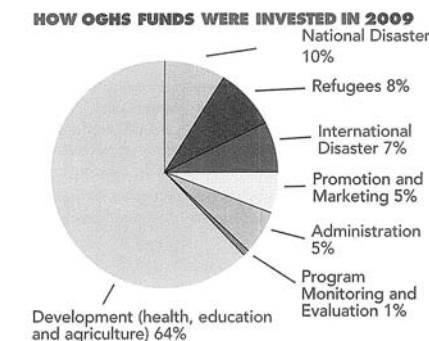

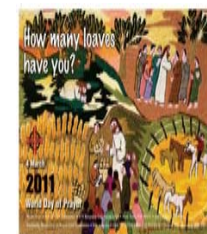
## ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING (OGHS)
