#### PREP /1 NEWS – MRS WHITE

Our class enjoyed a visit to the library and borrowed a book to take home. Our borrowing day will be Friday. Home reading will begin after Parent night next Wednesday.

Preps have learnt the words 'l' and 'am'. We are using the 's' sound to look at what starts with this sound. In Mathematics we are sorting objects into groups ... for example- all the big things go in one group and all the not big things in another.



Year 1 is learning their new sight words, reading books and writing sentences about feelings. In Mathematics we are counting to 30 and then 50 in 2's and 10's and building these numbers.

#### 2/3 NEWS – MRS TILNEY

Thank you to the P&C for purchasing new desks for our classroom. The desks look fantastic and our children enjoying the new learning environment.

This term we are thinking about words that make our writing very exciting. The children are using these 'Wow' words to describe and persuade. We are also exploring living things in our environment, and the life cycle of plants. In math we are using the "Part Part Whole" strategy to build familiarity with fact families. The children have hit the ground running and we are very busy! We look forward to showing some of our work on Orientation night.

#### 3/4 NEWS- MISS WRIGHT

#### Dear Parents/Caregivers,

Welcome back! The school year is already upon us and we have got straight into our workload for the year. Our class has started off Term 1 with the subjects of English, Mathematics, Science, Civics and Citizenship, and Technology.

In English, we are exploring narratives and the novel 'The Twits' by Roald Dahl. In Maths, we are currently looking at numbers to 1000 (Grade Three) and numbers to 10 000 (Grade Fours). Science this term is focussed on living things and life cycles. In Technology, we are going to be designing and programming games and last, but not least, we will be learning about democracy, rules and laws in Civics and Citizenship.

Class work is well underway and, as of this week, we have started our homework. Students have set up their homework books with a note explaining their homework expectations and keeping a record of their home reading. I will also be able to give you further information about our classroom, face-to-face, at the Parent Information Night that will be held in the coming weeks.

#### 5/6 NEWS - MRS IBBERTSON & MRS MINNS




#### And we're off and racing....

This term our year 5/6 class is delighted to have hit the ground running with some valued new additions to our school and our class. We welcome last year's Yr 4 class and also Hannah, Darcy and Isla.

For a quick overview of what we will be exploring this semester please see below:

# Science: Diversity and interaction in the living world

In this unit, students will explore the structural features and behavioural adaptations that assist living things to survive in their environment. They will use simulations to plan and conduct fair tests and analyse the results of these tests. Students will investigate the relationship between the growth and survival of living things and the physical conditions of their environment. They will investigate factors that influence how animals survive in extreme environments. Students will develop an understanding of Australian Aboriginal peoples' knowledge of the environment that enables them to live sustainably.



# Civics: Exploring the roles and responsibilities of governments and citizens in Australia

In this unit students study the key institutions of Australia's democratic government, including state/territory and federal parliaments, and the court system. Students learn how state/territory and federal laws are made in a parliamentary system. Students examine Australian citizenship and reflect on the rights and responsibilities that being a citizen entails. They also explore the obligations that people may have as global citizens. Through the study of civics and citizenship, students can develop skills of inquiry, values and dispositions that enable them to be active and informed citizens.





#### Visual Arts: The animal within

In this unit, students focus on representation of animals as companion, metaphor, and predator. Students will:

• explore and explain the representation of values, beliefs in sculptural artworks by artists including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and Asian artists and consider this in the development of their own artworks

• experiment with and use visual conventions and practices (ceramic sculpture, collage, surface manipulation, three-dimensional form, mixed media) in research and development of individual artworks which express a personal view

• plan the presentation of sculptural animals to enhance meaning for audience with description of influence and personal view

• compare visual art conventions and the representation of animals in three-dimensional artworks from different cultures, times and places and use art terminology to explain the communication of meaning.

**Homework** will be given and collected on a weekly basis and will be written in student planners. Please email me if you have any comments or questions. I am looking forward to a year of fun, learning and outstanding outcomes for all students.

#### English

In this unit the children will be completing an author study. We will be reading books written by Jacki French and comparing the language choices that are used in a variety of texts. Our class will form an expert panel to discuss the novels and present their ideas to the class.

#### **Mathematics**

In the coming weeks we will developing our speed and accuracy in learning multiples and multiplication facts. Students explore a range of ways to represent multiplication facts. Fast recall of our facts is critical. Please encourage your child to learn their facts!




#### PLEASE UPDATE MEDICAL RECORDS


# GYMNASTICS COACHING- AUSTRALIAN SPORTING SCHOOLS GRANT!
