

#### A Welcome Guest

Dear Friends,

Someone was joking about their overgrown garden: "It's a wild-life area. What's wrong with a few brambles? It's good for butterflies." It could be just a convenient excuse. But there is some sense in it. Bees, birds and insects do need some habitats that are not sprayed, mown and weeded.

Our village churchyards may not always be as neat as a municipal flower garden. But they're good places to spot a passing muntjac or listen to a woodpecker. A few weeds only add to the peaceful charm. Who knows what else may also be quietly flourishing in these environments? A few years ago, some experts came as part of a national survey of lichen populations, and were very interested in some of the growths we had here – a sign of relatively clean air.

Hilfield, the Franciscan Priory in Dorset, are even organising an event called 'What's the point of nettles?' "Come and discover the wonders of this annoying weed," they say, "and be transformed into a nettle lover." Of course their interests run much wider than this. They point out that St Francis was a pioneer ecologist, with his sense of oneness with the rest of creation, and his belief in simplicity of life.

Christians are keen to play their part in looking after our beautiful planet, with all its diversity. Anglicans list as one of their 'five marks of mission', "To strive to safeguard the integrity of creation and sustain and renew the earth". In many parts of the world, local Anglican Churches have given support and leadership to initiatives to protect the environment. The Anglican Communion Environmental Network aims to educate Anglicans as individuals and as communities to become better stewards of the world's resources.

Practically speaking, there are churches in Suffolk that have obtained grants to install solar heating and ground source heat pumps. I know of one church that is proud of its new Eco-toilet, which doesn't depend on mains sewage or costly waste-water charges. Perhaps our village churches could become centres for promoting a more sustainable lifestyle.

They could host community-run shops and cafés, making it easier to shop and socialise locally, and save unnecessary journeys.

At the end of this month, we are running a Quiet Day at a farm, where part of the purpose is to think about these issues, drawing on Christian ideas and inspiration. We look forward to finding what fresh ideas or vision may come from it.

## **Update from C.A.W.S (Communities Against Waste Site)**

"The Mayday meeting called by the waste site resistance group 'CAWS' at Stanton village hall was a vigorous event with the organizers struggling to find seating for the large audience.

The guest for the evening was conservative MP Richard Spring. Prior to the meeting local district councillor Jim Thorndyke had driven out to see the proposed site on Shepherds Grove.

The Chairman for the evening was Don Haynes supported by CAWS founder, Amber Newman. The meeting kicked off with a video presentation. It showed a stark, slightly frightening, picture of what might be coming to Shepherds Grove.

At previous meetings, councillors and another Member of Parliament have shown tendencies to equivocate rather that voice a clear position. they have tried to appear as neutral referees rather than players who have a hand in the formation of policy. The Chair and Amber Newman were determined that this would not be the case at this meeting.

Richard Spring was refreshingly unambiguous and declared that he was against a waste site at Stanton. The basis of his argument being that the area is rural and totally unsuitable for a massive industrial development such as an incinerator. He also agreed that local roads were unsuitable.

Questions and opinions from the floor were intelligent, many and passionately held. From stumbling beginnings earlier in the year it is impressive how a local body of knowledge and anger is growing. One lady in the audience pointed out that there is a national dimension with perhaps one hundred and sixty (160) incinerators being planned nationwide. In this season of elections it does illustrate the voters dilemma. The European Union has dictated this waste policy to us and the Labour government imposes it on to the County Councils.

Our County Council is controlled by the Conservatives who do not have the guts to resist. If you do not want an incinerator, who do you vote for? Peter Rudderham

### **BILL'S BIRDS**

In my last Bill's Birds, I encouraged you to come to our bird walk on 8th May. Twenty plus of you did so, but, after weeks of very little rain Suffolk Coastal region had a downpour lasting two hours, which began just as we set out from Southwold Common at 10.30 am. Oh dear! Several of you wisely decided not to continue after half a mile. The rest, hoping only for a passing shower, decided to carry on. After crossing the Blythe Bridge under a continuous deluge, we turned left to the nearest place of cover and sustenance. We were grateful to the management of the Anchor Hotel at Walberswick who supplied coffee or hot chocolate.

As the rain continued the unanimous decision was to return to our cars at Southwold. A washout - never in ten years has this happened. A bedraggled flock of sodden would-be bird watchers trouped back the way they had come. Of course on arrival back at Rickinghall out came the sun accompanied by a stiff breeze, (which soon dried out the dripping rainwear).

It will probably be the best remembered bird outing ever. On such an outing one becomes aware of a grand community spirit and comradeship. We have now had our soaking. It won't reoccur on the law of averages, (ha, ha!), so we look forward to 2010 with our usual optimism.

Meanwhile here the Swallows were late, the first sighting in Botesdale on 23rd April. Swifts screamed in on 9th May, though singles had been seen earlier. House Martins are right down in numbers; only occasional ones seen by 10th May. Of the Cuckoo, more hearings than last year, the first in Rickinghall on 17th April.

Several excitements: two Avocets circled a small lake in Wortham on 20th April, and believe it or not, a Crane was seen over-flying Redgrave Fen on 4th May, verified by a "proper" bird watcher leading a Dawn Chorus Walk.

Visits to local reserves revealed excellent sightings and hearings. A Nightingale and Turtle Dove at the car park at Lackford Lakes Reserve. There was the usual cacophony of sound at Minsmere. The Black Headed Gull invasion ousting some of the regular Avocets.

The return of the terns, the Common Tern being the most frequently seen, but Sandwich and Little Tern also present. The scratchy squeak of the tern is a welcome sound after a long winter and cold spring. Bearded Tits were seen in good numbers and showing well, seemingly oblivious of us watchers. And the Bittern? I have never heard such booming as occurred on a visit to Walberswick Dingle reed beds.

### **Picture Post**

Seven years I started researching my family history. My research quickly led to Semer, Suffolk, where I discovered where many of my ancestors had originated and found many living relatives in the area. This in turn developed my interest in social history and I now have files of information and old photographs, collected during my research, which I use when giving historical talks as a speaker to local groups. Vintage photographs are treasures to be preserved, giving us a window on the past. Many people keep these treasures in old boxes, drawers or under beds where they are subject to humidity and fading. To preserve photographs for future generations, photographs should be carefully arranged in archival acid free albums or boxes. If your photographs are glued into old albums, the safest way to preserve them is to carefully try to remove the photos with a small spatula, but do not force them in case they tear. If you cannot remove the photos easily, you can try cutting around them, leaving the album backing and remounting them in an archival acid free album. If your old album is mounted both sides and you cannot cut around the photos, instead interleave the pages with acid free paper and store the whole album in an acid free box. Make sure photographs are labelled with names, places and dates. I have been given many vintage photographs of family, who cannot be accurately identified due to lack of labelling. It is useful to make copies of the oldest and most treasured images either as a back up or to share with other family members.

Once copied onto your computer, it is then possible to repair scratches, tears, stains and other damage. You can copy a photograph using a good scanner that can scan at 300dpi resolution, saving your image as a TIFF rather than a JPEG to avoid compression and subsequent quality loss.

If your image is stuck in an album, making it difficult to scan, the alternative is to use a digital camera to make a copy. To do this, you need to set your camera to capture a RAW image, aperture priority somewhere between F8-F16 and using the lowest ISO your camera allows. You will also need a tripod and it is essential to ensure the flash is switched off. Once your camera is on the right settings, arrange the photograph in a position where it is completely flat and the light is

even. Then take your image, preferably using a remote control. This will give you an excellent quality copy of your original photograph. Whenever you want to copy photographs, the issue of copyright arises. Whoever took the photographs in your album owns the copyright, so if you took the photos, you own the copyright and can copy them as much as you wish. If the photographs were taken by a professional however, the situation is different. There is no copyright on photos before 31 Dec.1945. After this date, copyright lasts for the photographer's lifetime plus 70 years, and photos in this category should not be copied without permission.



My name is John Vickers of Barn Lodge, High Street and I have recently taken over from Maggi Churchouse and Rachel Waldron as Co-ordinator for the TheInetham Neighbourhood Watch Scheme. I'm sure you would like to join me in thanking both Maggi and Rachel for their sterling work over the past 6 years.

The main aim of the scheme is to create a partnership between our village community, the police and the local authority to cut crime and the opportunities for crime and to provide appropriate up-to-date crime reduction advice.

Most crime is opportunist, committed on the spur of the moment, or when a car, house or garage is left unlocked. This means there is enormous scope for reducing chances for criminals.

Statistically, Thelnetham has a relatively low incidence of crime but we must not become complacent.

Our village Police Community Support Officer is Jonathan Burke, PCSO 3123. Jonathan works alongside Police Officers tackling lower level crime such as anti-social behaviour, criminal damage, graffiti, parking issues etc. and can be contacted on 01284 774100.

## What you should do

Review your home, car and garage physical security measures and improve where necessary.

Review your security regime. It's no good having locks, alarms, lighting timers etc. if we don't utilise them!

Review your insurance policies to ensure adequate cover. Postcode, UV mark, photograph and record details of all valuables. Most companies



offer a discount to NW members.

Be alert and always report anything suspicious.

Do not hesitate to call 999 if you think a Police Officer should attend an incident.

Register with Police Direct to receive up to date information from Suffolk Constabulary about crime incidents, crime reduction advice, major traffic disruptions and much more. This is a free service available via E-mail, text and voice messaging.
