News from Bathurst Heritage Trust


If you've lived in the Maritimes, you may remember the CBC television program Don Messer's Jubilee and if you remember that, you will surely remember Charlie Chamberlain one of the stars of the program. Charlie Chamberlain was born and raised in Bathurst and if he was still alive he would have turned 100 this year. People in Bathurst remember Charlie and are proud to call him one of their own!

This summer in July, Bathurst will be celebrating Charlie's Centennial in July. The event will feature a Meet and Greet for family members and friends coming from across the country and the USA. It will also include the opening of one of Bathurst's heritage buildings, locally known as the Old Post Office in downtown. The Old Post Office will house a minimuseum of memorabilia related to Charlie Chamberlain as well as offering viewings of previous airings of Don Messer's Jubilee from the early 1960's.

The main event for the celebration will be a full day of musical entertainment which will include several members of Charlie's family, other local performers and a group called the North Shore Fiddlers who will no doubt all keep the crowd entertained and reminiscing about the great old music.

Charlie's Centennial will wrap up with a graveside service in Belledune, N.B. where Charlie and his beloved wife Lydia are buried side by side. The graveside service will be followed by a picnic in Belledune which will again include a local group of performers to entertain the crowd.
