6) <u>Repetition</u>

Scoring: Give one point if he/she repeats it correctly on the first try (can leave off "s" on the word "and" and still receive one point.

7) <u>3-Stage Command</u>

Tell the patient that you are going to give a set of instructions, and that you will read them only once. Then, give the patient a plain piece of paper and say "Take this paper in your right hand, fold it in half, and put it on the floor."

8) <u>Reading</u>

Show the patient a piece of paper with "CLOSE YOUR EYES" printed on it.
