It wasn't too long ago that Sobeida was addicted to drugs and alcohol. She had lost just about everything - her home, her friends,

her job. She knew she needed help when she faced losing her daughter, Lourdez. Sobeida and Lourdez moved into the Shelter.

Immediately, Sobeida enrolled in a training program to become an In Home Care Assistant. She has maintained sobriety for more than a year, saved money towards her own place, continues to receive counseling for drug and alcohol abuse, and takes parenting and ESL classes. Her English has so improved that she recently spoke on behalf of PVSS to United Way of Santa Cruz County.



When Aidee's Dad left her and her Mom behind, they found themselves in dire circumstances. Alejandra had not worked outside the home and did not speak English. Like so many before her, she found herself homeless and scared. She was referred to the Shelter where she and her daughter have flourished.

Alejandra developed a self-sufficiency plan with her Case Manager that included ESL and parenting classes, finding childcare, getting a

job and saving money. She's met all of these goals. Today Alejandra is working full time as a nanny, Aidee is in childcare and will start school in the Fall, and they are looking for a home of their own.

As we near Mother's Day 2006, these two moms have much to celebrate. They each faced difficult challenges and overcame them with determination and courage.

The Bravo family never expected to face the dilemma of separating from each other in order to find a place to stay, but that was exactly the situation they faced.

When the picking season ended, Mr. and Mrs. Bravo couldn't find an affordable place to rent. With four children, every place was either to expensive or wouldn't rent to a family their size.

Desperate for a safe place for his family, Mr. Bravo brought his wife and three of their children to our Emergency Shelter for Women and Children. They sent their oldest son to live with relatives. Mr. Bravo stayed at an overnight shelter for men.

Even as they lived apart, they agreed to a family plan together with our Case Manager. Their plan consisted of a job search, couples counseling, saving money for stable housing, developing parenting skills and reuniting with their son.

During their separation, they were able to save enough money for rental housing and find jobs that would cover their expenses. In just a few months – reunited they moved into a home of their own. They accomplished all their goals and more – and are forever grateful for Pajaro Valley Shelter Services and a community that supported them in their time of need.

Our two key programs:

- Emergency Shelter for Homeless Women and Children
 Transitional Housing for Homeless Families
- Transitional Housing for Homeless Families

are designed to help families help themselves by learning new job and language skills, linking with community services, and saving money so they can get – and keep – secure housing.

Both of our programs provide women, children and families the opportunity to:

- stabilize the immediate crisis,
- identify patterns that lead to cycles of homelessness, and
- develop and implement long-term strategies and skills for breaking this cycle.

Case management, and especially bilingual case management, is the key to helping families break a cycle of homelessness. Whether clients are in the Emergency Shelter or Transitional Housing Program, we help each family identify what led to their being homeless, connect them to services and resources in the community and develop strategies to stabilize their lives and start on a path to economic and personal self-sufficiency.
