## What's in the Wind?

For a number of years now there have been conversations about how to get the most out of the Cazier Family Organization. Over the sixty-three reunions the family members have been decreasing in numbers. A lot of the older generation that were here for the first reunion, held in Warm River, Idaho, have been passing on and not being replaced by the younger generation.

In 1990 (22 years ago) I was asked to become the Secretary/Treasurer for Cazier Family Organization. My oldest child was twelve and pulled the strings to get us involved. I remember in those days there were normally over one-hundred in attendance at the reunions and normally an acceptable group of kids. Today's average is under fifty and few young people.

In the recent past there have been a number of attempts to encourage younger people to attend and we have had some success but most of them have been from local families. Games and programs especially for youth have been used but still the same kids seldom return.

If we don't start having younger people come to the reunions and **participate as leaders**, the reunions will soon end. We need to bring our children and grandchildren year after year and set a habit of it. Base your vacation around it.

There is conversation to have semiannual or quarterly newsletters to mostly report on the genealogy work being done. The intent is to send these newsletters out only by e-mail to save cost. I like this idea as I can't capture the information given in the genealogy meetings to be put in the newsletters. It moves too fast. However if we don't have an e-mail address for you, you will not receive it.

There is conversation in not sending newsletters to addresses that have had no reverse activity for a long time. In reverse activity I mean, no dues paid, not attending any reunions, no change in addresses. Basically an indication that you are actually at the address.

In 2008 I sent out 114 stamped self addressed post cards with the newsletter to the addresses that showed no activity for over 15 years. Only 18 postcards were returned. 90 were removed from the active mailing list. We are thinking of doing this again.

Only about half the addresses in the data base have **ever** paid dues. Normally the average is about 30 addresses a year pay dues and most of them are the same people. There is talk about raising the dues.

In my 22 years as Secretary/Treasurer I have had some good times, met a lot of good people and traveled to places I may not have otherwise gone.

My favorite reunion was the one in Nauvoo, IL. Seeing a lot of history and spending a lot of time with my family. Of course the Seattle one was good as well. I have good memories and so do my children.

The only way to keep the reunions and the Family organization going is to take your children and grand children to the reunions. Let them see that you believe it is important. Let them see you volunteer to help. Let them see you pay your dues

Years from now will they ask what happened to the reunions we went to or will they talk about the good time they had at last years Reunion and make plans for the next.

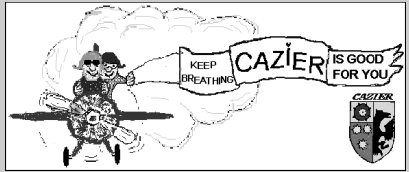
