Bryant University is located in Smithfield, RI just 20 minutes north of Providence and one hour from Boston. Bryant is a completely enclosed campus on over 400 acres, yet easily accessible by major highways. ## Application & Medical Form

The attached application must be completed and returned to Hoop Group, Inc. with either your deposit or full payment as soon as possible. It is necessary to submit a full medical report that includes an up-to-date shot record. You may send your physician's own form or download the camp form from our website. This form must be submitted prior to the start of camp but not necessarily with your application. Be sure the form includes a player's full medical history and complete shot records.

**We would like to have all records, as well as balance due by June 25th.** By opening day, no player can be considered in good standing for registration without his full payment and medical forms. **There is limited enrollment. Sign up now.**

## Honors

## Directions to Bryant University

**From Boston/Points North:** Take I-95 South to Exit 4 (I-295 south) follow to Exit 8B (route 7 North). Follow for 1 mile. Bryant is at the 3rd traffic light on the left.

**From NY City/Points South:** Take I-95 North to Exit 11 (I-295 North) to Exit 8B (Route 7 North). North for 1 mile. Bryant is at the 3rd traffic light on the left.

**Mass. Pike.** Take Exit 10A off Mass Pike (I-90) to Route 146 South, to I-295 South. Take I-295 to Exit 8B (Route 7 North). Follow Route 7 North for 1 mile. Bryant is at the 3rd traffic light on left.

**Cape Cod (Bourne Bridge):** Take Route 25 to I-195 west to Route 95 North to I-295 South to Route 7 north (Exit 8B). Bryant is at the 3rd traffic light on the left.
