Scott Erickson Michael Rivers Calvin Kunkle Penny Thiede-Klish The Raptor Center from the University of Minnesota will bring eagles and other birds of prey. At **11:00** they will present a program and then answer questions and provide information about the birds. It is a real treat to see these huge birds up close.

Jim Swanson, the voyageur from the 1700s, will bring his canoe and discuss the importance of the rivers in the history of our state. Jim will be set up during the **morning**, demonstrating what a voyageur needed to survive the weather and rivers of Wisconsin.

Bill Dingwall, an outdoor educator with the Menomonie School System will be presenting *Who Gives a Hoot?* Everyone will be able to dissect an owl pellet and see what the owl ate. Bill will present his program around **1:00**.

DNR representatives will be on hand to answer any questions all day. The Chamber of Commerce will have the depot staffed and ready to answer any questions about the area. We have new tee shirts for you to purchase and you will be able to pay your dues at our welcome table. Members of the Friends of the Red Cedar Trail/ Hoffman Hills are still working on more ideas for the day. Join us to see what is happening on the trail.

The festivities end at **2:00**, but everyone is encouraged to walk, bike and use the Red Cedar Trail and to enjoy the view out at Hoffman Hills.

## Trail Manager's Report

It's been quite the start for spring, it goes from 80 degree days in March and then down to 40's for April. Well the good weather did get biking season going early. Now that bike season is getting going the DNR has hired additional help for the summer. You may meet Melisa Erwin who is now our new part time Visitor Services Associate or Dan Kilps or fulltime summer Laborer along the trails. Please welcome them in their new positions.

This spring also gave us good weather for some volunteer projects. We had another successful oak planting at Hoffman Hills with 100 trees planted and shelters erected for protection. I took a look this week and leaves are starting to develop on many of the oak trees. We also worked with a group of stout students from the national charity fraternity of Alpha Phi Omega picking up abandoned tires near the new tree planting at Hoffman Hills. The Red Cedar Trail didn't get forgotten as a group of Menomonie middle school students helped remove invasive species, cut trees in the prairie garden, and cleaned around the Depot.

And finally an update on the trail repairs at Hoffman Hills. Trail work will continue this spring and summer depending on when it stops raining. Some additional trails will be rerouted to make them more sustainable and flow better with existing trails. As part of this project a timber sale will be conducted to open up new trail corridors and remove hazardous trees. Signs will be put along access points to inform visitors of active work sites but it's also recommended to stay at least 300 feet away from heavy equipment operations.

I hope you enjoy these beautiful spring days along the trails. Spring wildflowers are really beginning to bloom, all sorts of butterflies are being seen, and many types of birds being heard.

## Treasurer's Report

Our 2011 membership collections amounted to a total of \$2,399.00 with half of the business collections going to the Hoffman Hills grooming account. That amount was \$644.50 leaving \$1,754.50 added to our previous balance for operations. We also receive a share of the dollars collected for trail passes which was \$1,635.20 for 2011.

As of April 30<sup>th</sup> we have \$4,783.91 in our operating cash account and \$713.00 for grooming at Hoffman Hills. Our Grant account has a remaining balance of \$124.00 and our Burr Oak Savanna/Hoffman Hills account has a balance of \$12,124.88.

MEMBERSHIP REMINDER: We rely a great deal on memberships for funding our operations so I would ask if you have not renewed yet for 2012, please consider doing so. This allows us to continue our funding for things like Earth Day and National Trails Day while also allowing us to help with many projects at the Red Cedar State Trail and Hoffman Hills State Park. We thank you for your continued support.

We've had wonderful spring weather to enjoy the Red Cedar Trail and Hoffman Hills. I hope you get a chance to come to the National Trails Day event on June 2<sup>nd</sup>.

We are having an annual meeting/picnic on Sunday September 9<sup>th</sup> at 4:30pm at the Depot Visitor Center and all are invited to attend.

There was a special dedication of a sign for the Don and Nona Schley Oak Savannah at Hoffman Hills by John Taylor of the Optimist club in April. The Oak Savannah would not have been possible without the Schley's generous donations.

A few volunteer projects have been going on at Hoffman Hills. Many thanks to Dennis Spader of the Optimist club for helping with the burning of brush in February as well as helping Menomonie High School students clear brush on Earth Day. Dennis also did a great job organizing volunteers to plant another 100 Bur Oaks a few hundred yards west of the observation tower. The protective tree shelters can be seen from the tower. Special thanks to the Colfax Comets 4-H club for providing so many volunteers. Thanks also to Diane Simon of the Optimist club for providing some very tasty box lunches for the volunteers. Ethan Young of the UW Stout chapter of the charity fraternity Alpha Phi Omega organized a cleanup of some discarded tires near the new Oak Savannah.

The Menomonie Middle school brought about 15 students and teachers to the Red Cedar Trail in April to help with parking lot sweeping, removing some brush and cutting some invasive Buckthorn. Thanks to Wal-Mart for providing two helpers with this project.

Trail rerouting at Hoffman Hills will be going on this summer to help with the many washouts that have occurred over the last several years. Please use caution when equipment is in operation in these areas.

The Depot Visitor Center is open on Saturday and Sunday from 9 to 5 and will be open Monday through Friday from 10 to 4 after Memorial Day through Labor Day. Stop in and see the displays and the educational materials we have. The DNR Wild Cards and Wisconsin Explorer booklets are very popular with children.
