HB 441 by Cantens, Berfield, Lerner, Heyman, Justice, Greenstein, Mahon, Murman, Machek, Rich, Bullard, Betancourt, Richardson, Russell, Weissman, Gannon, Kilmer, Ausley, Lynn, Mealor, Trovillion, Needelman, Harrell, Melvin, Ryan, Wilson, Fiorentino, Clarke, Stansel, Baxley, Gottlieb, Flanagan and Slosberg (Identical S 0722)

License Plate/ Breast Cancer Research; provides for Breast Cancer Research license plate; provides for use fee; directs HSMV to develop said license plate; provides for distribution & use of fees. Amends 320.08056,.08058. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 561 by Ball, Fiorentino, Harrell and Kilmer (Similar S 0350)

Parking Permits/ Disabled Persons; provides that certain advanced registered nurse practitioners & physician assistants may provide certification for disability required for issuance of disabled parking permit. Amends 320.0848. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Transportation: Favorable; Health Regulation: Favorable; Council for Ready Infrastructure: Favorable

HB 641 by State Administration (SGC) and Brummer (Identical S 1910)

Legislature/ Resolution of Impasse; eliminates certain requirements of Legislature regarding resolution of impasse re collective bargaining; provides statement of Legislature's discretionary authority to address disputed impasse issues. Amends 447.403. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/ HB 667 by Council for Lifelong Learning and Holloway (Similar S 0572)

**School-related Events/ Invocation**; authorizes individual district school boards by resolution to allow invocation or benediction at specified secondary school-related events; provides legislative intent & severability. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

CS/ HB 811 by Council for Ready Infrastructure, Select Committee on Security (PRC), Bense, Gelber, Ball, Green, Cusack, Cantens, Hart, Machek, Harrell, Goodlette and Pickens (Similar CS/S 0972)

Seaport Security Infrastructure; adds seaport security infrastructure measures to list of projects eligible for funding by grant under Fla. Seaport Transportation & Economic Development Program; exempts such measures from certain matching fund requirements; provides for expiration of such provisions; authorizes seaports to request specified changes in purpose of work program projects; provides for allocation & use of specified federal funds. National Guard/ Residency/ Tuition; cites act as "Sergeant Larry Bowman Act"; revises provisions re determination of residency for tuition purposes to classify certain members of active Florida National Guard as residents for tuition purposes. Amends 240.1201. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

HJR 87 by Wallace, Mack, Attkisson, Brown, Davis, Rubio, Andrews, Kyle, Kottkamp and Littlefield (Similar S 1042)

Limitation on State Appropriations; constitutional amendment to replace state revenue limitation with appropriations limitation that limits state appropriations for any fiscal year to state appropriations for prior fiscal year plus growth adjustment; bases growth adjustment on Florida median household income rather than on aggregate personal income of Floridians, etc. Amends s. 1, Art. VII, s. 21, Art. XII.

State Administration: Favorable; Fiscal Policy & Resources: Favorable with one amendment

HJR 89 by Wallace, Mack, Hogan, Brown, Davis, Rubio, Andrews, Kyle, Kottkamp and Littlefield

Legislative Power Limitation/ Taxes; constitutional amendment to require that any law that imposes tax, fee, penalty, or fine, expands tax base, or increases tax rate, fee, penalty, or fine be enacted in separate bill by 2/3rds vote of each house of Legislature after 01/01/2003; requires that any law that repeals exemption from tax, fee, penalty, or fine be enacted in separate bill by 2/3rds vote of each house of Legislature after 01/01/2008. Amends s. 1, Art VII, s. 26, Art. XII.

State Administration: Favorable; Fiscal Policy & Resources: Favorable

**HB 145** by Wishner, Mahon and Mayfield (Identical S 0624, Similar H 0025)

Florida Golf License Plate; provides for said license plate; provides for use fee; directs HSMV to develop said plate; provides for distribution & use of fees; requires Florida Sports Foundation to establish youth golf program; provides for advisory committee. Amends 320.08056,08058. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Transportation: Favorable; Fiscal Policy & Resources: Favorable; Council for Ready Infrastructure: Favorable

HB 159 by Bullard (Identical S 0936)

Boulevard Designations/ Miami-Dade; designates "Steven Cranman Boulevard" & "Ethel Beckford Boulevard" in Miami-Dade County; designates "Phicol Williams Boulevard" in Miami-Dade County; designates "Arthur Mays Boulevard" in Miami-Dade County; directs DOT to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Transportation: Favorable with one amendment; Council for Ready Infrastructure: Favorable with four

HB 183 by Gardiner and Spratt (Identical S 0344)

Motor Vehicles/ Pre-delivery Services; repeals provision re provision of law making it deceptive & unfair trade practice for motor vehicle dealer to add certain additional charges for pre-delivery services; provides for retroactive application. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Transportation: Favorable; Agriculture & Consumer Affairs: Favorable; Council for Ready Infrastructure: Favorable

HB 325 by Prieguez (Identical S 1010)

Coral Gables/ Le Jeune Road; designates specified portion of Le Jeune Road in City of Coral Gables in Miami-Dade Co. as state historic road; prohibits expenditure of state funds for certain purposes; provides construction of act; directs Historical Resources Division of Dept. of State to provide for erection of suitable markers. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Transportation: Favorable; Fiscal Policy & Resources: Favorable; Council for Ready Infrastructure: Favorable

**HB 329** by Baker, Stansel and Jordan (Similar S 1228)

**Small Aircraft Transportation**; provides legislative intent re NASA's Small Aircraft Transportation System. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Transportation: Favorable; Transportation & Economic Development Appropriations: Favorable; Council for Ready Infrastructure: Favorable

HB 439 by Stansel, Mahon, Kravitz, Gibson, Attkisson, Melvin, Baxley, Cusack, Baker, Kendrick, Spratt, Heyman, Harrington, Waters, Allen, Hogan and Dockery (Similar S 0496)

Military/ Dependent Education Benefit; provides educational opportunity at state expense for dependent children of military personnel who died or suffered service-connected 100-percent total & permanent disability in Operation Enduring Freedom; specifies documentation which constitutes proof of eligibility for such benefits. Creates 295.0185. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Colleges & Universities: Favorable; Education Appropriations: Favorable; Council for Lifelong Learning: Favorable

HB 465 by Baxley, Mahon, Harrington and Hogan (Identical S 0534)
