Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time February 7, 2016

Ash Wednesday:

The Lenten season begins on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 10th.

Mass with distribution of ashes will be celebrated at **7:30 am** and **7:00 pm.**

A **simple soup and bread supper** will be served in the parish center prior to the evening Mass, beginning at 5:30 pm. All are welcome!

Ash Wednesday as well as Good Friday (March 25) are days of *fast* and *abstinence*.

"Fasting" means that a person is permitted to eat one full meal during the day as well as two smaller meals, but not to equal a full meal.

"Abstinence" from meat is also obligatory on the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is obligatory from age 18 until age 59. Abstinence is binding from age 14 onwards.

These general norms must be applied prudently according to the particular circumstances of a person's health and dietary needs, and even social obligations.

A Word from Father...

Dear Friends,

On Tuesday of this past week, the Church celebrated the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the temple



in Jerusalem...forty days after his birth. That was a traditional thing to do for Jewish families of that time, somewhat akin to our own practice of infant baptism. One of the traditions of the feast is to bless the candles that will be used in the church during the coming year, and the prayers of blessing stress the importance of Christ, the Light of the World especially in its spiritual darkness.

The feast gave us one more little gasp of Christmas spirit just days before we begin our Lenten season with its sober atmosphere of penance and contrition. Happily, the Presentation and the blessing of candles also pointed us towards the feast of all feasts, the Lord's Resurrection where his Light truly and fully embraces the world and wraps it in his mantle of grace and infuses it with Life without end.

The great symbol of this Light and Life is, of course the Paschal Candle which is lit for the first time at the Easter Vigil after it is blessed and then incensed and praised in the most beautiful hymn, the Exultet. All church candles and especially the Paschal Candle are potent symbols of the mysteries we celebrate both in the Christmas season and during Holy Week: the candle can only overcome darkness with light if it allows itself to burn down, even as Jesus offers his Light and Life to our world through the self-giving love manifest in his incarnation (letting go of his godhood and take on with us flesh and blood), and his passion and death, and in his passion and death, (giving up of his flesh and blood, his heart and soul), so that we might live within the fullness of light that is true freedom, real justice, and perfect peace.



When Jesus is presented in the temple, the old prophet, Simeon declares: Lord, now you may *let your servant go in peace;* your word has been fulfilled: my own eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared in

the sight of every people: a light to reveal you to the nations and the glory of your people Israel!

May our eyes see this same light in the Lenten and Easter weeks to come!
