FIRST PITCH

- Texas Tech begins a five-game stretch against ranked opponents Tuesday night when the 19th-ranked Red Raiders open a midweek series at No. 5 Florida State with a 5 p.m. CT first pitch at Dick Howser Stadium.
- Texas Tech will play the Seminoles twice before heading to No. 16 Oklahoma State to continue Big 12 Conference play on Friday. The Red Raiders will have played 13 games this season against nationally-ranked opponents following the OSU series.
- Texas Tech is 4-4 against ranked opponents this season which includes a 3-1 mark against top-10 teams as the Red Raiders have defeated No. 9 Houston, No. 6 Louisiana and No. 9 California already this season.
- This will be the first all-time meeting between Texas Tech and Florida State on the baseball diamond. The Red Raiders are making their first trip to the state of Florida since traveling to Miami for the 2014 NCAA Coral Gables Regional.
- Texas Tech is heading on the road to face a current Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) opponent for the first time during the regular season since 1998 when the Red Raiders traveled to face Miami in Coral Gables. Tech is 8-7 all-time against current members of the ACC.
- The Red Raiders are coming off a three-game sweep of Kansas State this past weekend at Dan Law Field at Rip Griffin Park. Texas Tech is now 8-1 in Big 12 play, marking its best start to the conference slate in school history.
- Texas Tech is 5-2 in midweek series this season which includes a 3-1 mark in games played away from Lubbock.
- Eric Gutierrez was named the Big 12 Co-Player of the Week on Monday afternoon after the senior led the conference with a .500 average last week. It marked the fourth career Player of the Week honor for Gutierrez which is tied with former Nebraska standout Ken Harvey (1999) for the most in Big 12 history.
- The Red Raiders are ranked as high as No. 19 in both the Collegiate Baseball Newspaper and Perfect Game polls this week. Texas Tech also came in at No. 22 and No. 23 in the D1Baseball and Baseball America rankings.
- The Red Raiders are among the top teams in the country this season in turning double plays as Texas Tech has 34 this season which currently ranks third nationally heading into this week.



Texas Tech is 12-9 all-time against top-10 ranked opponents under fourth-year head coach Tim Tadlock, including a 3-1 mark this season.

INSIDE THE FLORIDA STATE SERIES

- Texas Tech and Florida State will be meeting for the first time ever on a baseball diamond Tuesday night.
- This will be Texas Tech's first trip to the state of Florida since the Red Raiders participated in the 2014 NCAA Coral Gables Regional hosted by the University of Miami. Tech defeated Miami in the regional finale on its way to advancing to the College World Series for the first time in school history.
- Texas Tech is heading on the road to face a current Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) opponent for the first time during the regular season since 1998 when the Red Raiders traveled to face Miami in Coral Gables.
- Texas Tech is 8-7 all-time against current members of the ACC - Clemson (2-2), Georgia Tech (1-2), Miami (2-2), North Carolina (2-0), Notre Dame (0-1) and Wake Forest (1-0).

TEXAS TECH NOTES

- Texas Tech currently ranks 29th in the ratings percentage index (RPI) poll conducted by *Boyd'sWorld.com*. The Red Raiders are the third-highest Big 12 team in the rankings behind only TCU (No. 15) and Oklahoma State (No. 18). The official NCAA RPI rankings debut Tuesday.
- The Red Raiders lead the Big 12 in the following categories heading into the Florida State series: walks (148), double plays (34), double plays per game (1.21), home runs (24), home runs per game (0.86) and sacrifice flies (15).
- In addition, Texas Tech also ranks second in the Big 12 for batting average (.294), doubles (60), doubles per game (2.14), on-base percentage (.399), runs (207), scoring (7.4), shutouts (3), slugging percentage (.442) and win-loss percentage (.714).
- Texas Tech ranks among the top 40 teams in the country in the following categories: double plays (3rd), double plays per game (4th), walks (14th), on-base percentage (27th), runs (27th), shutouts (30th), doubles (30th), win-loss percentage (31st), scoring (35th) and sacrifice flies (39th).
- Texas Tech improved to 8-1 in Big 12 play with a three-game sweep over Kansas State last weekend. It marks Tech's best start to conference play in school history, topping the previous 7-2 mark from the 1999 season.
- The series sweep against K-State extended Texas Tech's Big 12 winning streak to seven games, its longest streak since the Red Raiders won eight in a row to close the 2002 regular season.
- Texas Tech has swept both Oklahoma and K-State on back-to-back weekends, marking the first time the Red Raiders have swept consecutive Big 12 series since taking all three games from those same two teams in 2014.
- Texas Tech began both the Baylor and Oklahoma series with 5-0 victories, marking the first time since 2001 where the Red Raiders have tossed back-to-back shutouts in Big 12 series openers.
- Texas Tech connected on six home runs during the K-State series, its most during a conference weekend since the Red Raiders crushed 10 in their 2010 series against Missouri.
- Texas Tech was boosted by a seven-run second inning in the series opener against K-State. The inning featured six-consecutive hits by the Red Raiders, their most in a row since recording eight-straight hits on April 7, 2004, against Howard Payne. That streak also occurred in the second inning.
- Texas Tech scored at least 10 runs over three-straight games against both UNLV (March 29) and Kansas State (April 2). The Red Raiders had not previously 10 or more runs in three-consecutive games since early in the 2010 season (Feb. 21-25) against the likes of Michigan, Jacksonville State and Bethune-Cookman.
- Texas Tech has scored 207 runs this season, its most through 28 games since the 2006 season when the Red Raiders recorded 216 runs at the midway point in the season.
- The Red Raiders have hit 24 home runs already this season, their most through 28 games since connecting on 27 during the 2010 season.
- The Red Raiders scored 10 or more runs 10 times already this season, their most through 28 games in a season since 2004 when Texas Tech reached double digits 12 times.
- Texas Tech has 35 victories in Big 12 play since the start of the 2014 season, which ranks third in the conference just a win back of second-place Oklahoma State.
- Texas Tech is hitting .306 in midweek series this season as the Red Raiders are averaging 9.86 runs per game. The Red Raiders have also recorded seven of their 24 home runs this season in midweek games.
- Texas Tech is 16-4 this season against non-ranked opponents with wins in 12 of the past 14 games.
- Texas Tech currently ranks second in the Big 12 with four victories over a ranked opponent this season. Texas leads the conference with five wins over nationally-ranked foes.
- The Red Raiders are among the top teams in the country this season with 34 double plays turned through 28 games. Texas Tech currently ranks third nationally heading into this week's series at Florida State.
- Texas Tech is a combined 14-2 this season when the Red Raiders hit at least one home run.
- Texas Tech is a perfect 19-0 this season when either leading or tied following the eighth inning.
- Texas Tech has scored 94 of its 207 runs (45 percent) within the first three innings this season.
- Texas Tech currently controls the Big 12 single-game high this season for home runs after hitting five on March 3 against New Mexico State.
- Texas Tech has already inserted 34 of 35 players on the 2016 roster through 16 games this season.
- Through 17 games at Dan Law Field at Rip Griffin Park this season, Texas Tech ranks among the national leaders in attendance. The Red Raiders currently rank 20th nationally in total attendance (55,381) and then 15th in average attendance (3,461).

GUTIERREZ TIES BIG 12 CAREER RECORD WITH FOURTH PLAYER OF THE WEEK ACCOLADE

Texas Tech senior first baseman Eric Gutierrez was named the Big 12 Co-Player of the Week on Monday after helping lead the Red Raiders to a three-game sweep of Kansas State this past weekend. This is the fourth career Big 12 Player of the Week honor for Gutierrez which breaks the school record that he previously shared with three other Red Raider All-Americans, including Roger Kieschnick (2006-08), Cameron Blair (2004-05) and Josh Bard (1997-99). Gutierrez is just the second player in Big 12 history to claim four or more Player of the Week awards, joining former Nebraska standout Ken Harvey who received the accolade four times during the 1999 season. Gutierrez led all Big 12 players with a .500 average (9-for-18) over Tech's five games last week against UNLV and K-State. He had at least one hit in all five games as he connected on three doubles and a home run while also driving in seven runs. In addition to leading the league in average last week, Gutierrez also shared the conference high for hits (9) and on-base percentage (.583) and ranked second for RBI (7), total bases (15) and doubles (3).

TEXAS TECH IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

- For the first time this season, Texas Tech is now ranked in four of the six major collegiate baseball polls. The Red Raiders are ranked as high as No. 19 in both the Collegiate Baseball Newspaper and Perfect Game polls and came in at No. 22 and No. 23 in the D1Baseball and Baseball America rankings.
- This is the first time this season where Texas Tech has appeared in both the Baseball America and D1Baseball polls.
- In addition to the four rankings, Texas Tech is also receiving votes in both the USA Today Coaches' and National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) polls.
- The Red Raiders began the year ranked 25th by Perfect Game and 39th by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. Tech was also receiving votes in the USA Today Coaches' and National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association polls.
- This is the second-straight year where the Red Raiders have started their season ranked in a preseason poll. It is the first time Texas Tech has appeared in the preseason rankings in consecutive seasons since prior to the 1999-2000 campaigns.

TIM TADLOCK NOTES

- Texas Tech is 122-83 under fourth-year head coach Tim Tadlock.
- Tadlock owns a collegiate career record of 557-210 during 13 years as head coach (9 at Grayson, 4 at Tech).
- Texas Tech is 44-37 in Big 12 Conference play under head coach Tim Tadlock.
- Texas Tech is 78-46 in non-conference games under head coach Tim Tadlock.
- Texas Tech is 96-50 all-time against non-ranked opponents under head coach Tim Tadlock.
- Texas Tech is 104-2 under Tadlock when leading after eight innings.
- Texas Tech is 80-31 all-time under head coach Tim Tadlock when scoring the first run of the game.
- Texas Tech has posted 47 come-from-behind wins under Tim Tadlock, including nine already this season.
- Texas Tech is 12-9 all-time against top-10 ranked opponents under head coach Tim Tadlock.

TEXAS TECH RANKS THIRD IN BIG 12 WINS SINCE 2014

Texas Tech been among the most consistent programs in the Big 12 since the start of the 2014 season as the Red Raiders rank third among league teams with 32 conference wins. Here is a look at where Tech ranks in Big 12 wins over the past two-plus seasons:

TURN TWO - RED RAIDERS ONCE AGAIN AMONG NATION'S ELITE IN DOUBLE PLAYS

Texas Tech has regularly ranked among the top teams in the country in doubles plays turned under head coach Tim Tadlock. The Red Raiders ranked seventh nationally in Tadlock's first season in 2013. Tech followed by finishing sixth in 2014 and then 14th in 2015. Just five weeks into the 2016 season and the Red Raiders are on pace to continue that trend as Tech ranks tied for third nationally with 34 double plays turned this season. The Red Raiders turned five double plays on Opening Day alone, their most ever in a season opener dating back to 1987.

Eric Gutierrez was named the Big 12 Co-Player of the Week on Monday, marking the fourth time in his career where he has earned the accolade. He is one of two Big 12 players all-time to be named the conference Player of the Week four times in a career.

TADLOCK MOVES INTO THIRD PLACE FOR CAREER WINS AT TEXAS TECH

Texas Tech head coach Tim Tadlock moved into sole possession of third place on the school's career wins chart on March 24 with a 5-0 victory over Oklahoma. The victory marked the 116th of Tadlock's career, moving the fourth-year skipper past Dan Spencer (2009-12) for third place all-time in program history. Tadlock led the Red Raiders to 26 victories his first season in 2013 (second-most by a Tech head coach in debut season). He followed with 45 wins - the fourth-most in school history - and Tech's first ever trip to the College World Series in 2014 before finishing with 31 victories a year ago. Tech is coming off consecutive 30-win seasons for just the first time since the 2005 and 2006 seasons.

TEXAS TECH TURNS TO FRESHMEN ON THE MOUND EARLY IN THE SEASON

- The Texas Tech rotation has featured a freshman starting pitcher in 12 of the past 15 games.
- Texas Tech has started a freshman on the mound in 19 of its 28 games this season. Ty Harpenau leads the group of freshmen with six starts already this season.
- Four different Red Raider freshmen have started on the mound this season - Steven Gingery, Ty Harpenau, Erikson Lanning and Davis Martin. Martin became the fourth Red Raiders to start on March 12 when he earned the nod against No. 9 California.
- Texas Tech had not previously started three true freshmen within the first five games of a season dating back to the start of the 2001 campaign.
- Texas Tech has used six different freshmen pitchers already this season in Lanning, Harpenau, Gingery, Martin, Ryan Shetter and Jonathan Nicholson.
- Over the first two games of the Baylor series, Martin and Gingery combined to allow just four hits, two each, over 11.0 shutout innings. The duo also combined on 10 strikeouts.
- Martin has already been called on five times out of the bullpen as he is 2-0 with two saves. He is the first Red Raider dating back to 1998 to record a win and two saves through the first six games of a season. Martin moved to the weekend rotation prior to the start of the California series.
- Gingery recorded his most impressive performance so far this season on March 2 as the left-hander struck out 12 hitters in a 14-2 rout of New Mexico State. His 12 strikeouts marked the most by a Tech freshman pitcher since Miles Morgan fanned 15 on March 18, 2006, against Texas. The performance earned Gingery his first career win.
- Harpenau is still looking for his first career win as he has earned six no-decisions despite several quality starts. Harpenau went five complete innings against both Milwaukee and No. 6 Louisiana and left the game with the Red Raiders tied in both outings.
- Lanning began his Red Raider career by tossing six shutout innings against Milwaukee where he allowed just one hit while striking out four in a 12-0 rout. The performance marked the first time a Red Raider freshman had earned the win and combined on a shutout in his career debut since Matt Withrow helped Texas Tech trounce Northern Illinois, 13-0, on Feb. 17, 2013.
- Shetter has already appeared nine times out of the bullpen, compiling a 2-1 record with a 3.57 ERA.

MARTIN BECOMES FIRST RED RAIDER FRESHMAN TO START A BIG 12 OPENER SINCE RAMOS

GARDNER, MARTIN COLLECT BIG 12 WEEKLY HONORS

- Texas Tech sophomore outfielder Tanner Gardner was named the Big 12 Player of the Week on Monday afternoon while freshman right-handed pitcher Davis Martin collected top newcomer honors.
- The weekly award was the first career accolade for both Gardner and Martin as the duo helped lead the Red Raiders (12-7; 2-1) to a 3-1 record last week, including a series win at Baylor in the Big 12 opener for both teams.
- Gardner led all Big 12 players last week with a .615 average (8-for-13) that included at least two hits in three of four games. The successful week pushed Gardner's average to a Big 12-leading .467 clip for the season. He is also the conference leader with a .568 on-base percentage and ranks second with 28 hits and fourth with a .600 slugging percentage.
- Gardner closed the series going 3-for-5 on Sunday, marking the fourth time already this season Gardner has recorded three or more hits.
- Martin, meanwhile, became the first Red Raider freshman in school history to earn the win in a Big 12 opener last Friday as he tossed six shutout innings in a 5-0 victory over Baylor. Martin, just the first Tech freshman to start a Big 12 opener since current Miami Marlin closer AJ Ramos in 2006, allowed just two hits and struck out four en route to leading the Red Raiders to their second shutout ever in a Big 12 opener.
- The shutout was also the first for Tech against Baylor since the Red Raiders claimed a 1-0 victory on March 5, 1993, in Lubbock. Tech had not previously shut out Baylor in Waco since recording a 4-0 victory on April 21, 1989.

STEPHEN SMITH NAMED BIG 12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Stephen Smith was named the Big 12 Player of the Week on Feb. 22 after the junior led the Red Raiders to a series win against Milwaukee. This is the first weekly award for Smith, who hit .571 overall (8-for-14) with seven runs scored, four doubles, five RBI, two stolen bases, a .857 slugging percentage and a .684 on-base percentage. He ended the weekend with at least a share of the Big 12 lead in five categories: hits, runs scored, doubles, total bases and on-base percentage. Smith, who had at least one hit in all four games in the series, is the first Red Raider outfielder to receive Big 12 Player of the Week accolades since Adam Kirsch earned the honor on May 19, 2014.

TEXAS TECH RETURNS BULK OF 2015 LINEUP

- Texas Tech head coach Tim Tadlock boasts one of the most experienced lineups of his tenure this season as the Red Raiders return 12 position players from a year ago, including seven starters. It marks the second time in the past three seasons Tech has returned at least seven position starters as the Red Raiders previously brought back eight starters prior to the 2014 campaign.
- In Texas Tech's group of seven returning position starters, five are seniors with a combined 539 games played over their career. Eric Gutierrez, Tyler Neslony and Zach Davis all feature three years of experience in a Red Raider uniform while Tyler Floyd and Cory Raley both transferred to Tech following successful junior-college careers.
- Texas Tech is tied with Oklahoma State and Baylor for the most position starters returning heading into this season.
- Texas Tech's group of returners accounted for 219 of the 269 RBI in 2015 (81 percent) as well as 33 of 41 home runs on the year (80 percent).
- The Red Raiders return their top four hitters (minimum of 50 at-bats) by average from the 2015 season in Cory Raley (.350), Eric Gutierrez (.315), Stephen Smith (.291) and Tyler Neslony (.286). That group combined for 23 home runs and 134 RBI during the 2015 season alone.

HOTTEST TICKET IN TOWN ... AGAIN

After selling out season tickets for the first time in program history prior to 2015 season, Texas Tech fans once again scooped up season tickets in record numbers as Tech sold more than 2,400 season tickets prior to Opening Day. Tech sold out of season tickets just a few weeks later, marking the second-straight year where Red Raider fans have purchased over 2,500 season tickets. Tech has ranked among the top 31 schools in the nation over the past 18 years in average attendance per game. Tech closed the 2015 season averaging 3,665 fans per game, a figure that ranked 13th nationally and the third highest in program history.

Michael Davis leads the Red Raiders with .433 average (13-for-30) and six RBI against nationally-ranked opponents this season. He has recorded four of his 10 doubles in those games as well.

Texas Tech junior right-handed pitcher Ryan Moseley - a 2013 graduate of Lubbock Cooper High School - is just the second Red Raider pitcher from Lubbock to earn the Opening Day start in back-to-back seasons since 1987. He joins former Red Raider and current Colorado Rockies right-hander Chad Bettis (2009-10) as the only Lubbock natives with multiple Opening Day starts.

RED RAIDERS SCHEDULED TO PLAY 10 GAMES AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS EARLY IN THE SEASON

Texas Tech will boast one of the toughest non-conference schedules in the country this season as the Red Raiders are slated to play 10 games against ranked opponents early in the season. The Red Raiders will face No. 6 Louisiana-Lafayette, No. 8 Arkansas and No. 12 Houston next weekend during the Shriners Hospitals for Children College Classic hosted by the Houston Astros. Tech will later face No. 7 Cal State Fullerton in a three-game series at home and then No. 8 California in a four-game set in Berkeley. Dating back to the 1995 season, Tech has never played 10 of its first 17 games in a season against top-25 foes. The previous high was nine games against ranked opponents to start the 2012 season.

NEW TURF, VIDEO BOARD HIGHLIGHT IMPROVEMENTS TO RIP GRIFFIN PARK

Red Raider fans will see a pair of new additions as they enter Dan Law Field at Rip Griffin Park this season as Texas Tech installed a new FieldTurf surface in December and then upgraded its video board to the version that previously occupied Jones AT&T Stadium. The nearly \$1 million project will provide Tech with one of the largest video boards in college baseball as well as a state-of-the-art playing surface. The screen size on the video board will more than double from 15-by-20 feet on the previous model to 48-by-22 feet. Both projects were funded privately through philanthropic contributions and gifts to The Campaign for Fearless Champions.

FLOYD EARNS HIS TEXAS TECH DEGREE PRIOR TO SENIOR SEASON

Tyler Floyd entered his senior season with a degree already in hand as the senior graduated this December with a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in the Texas Tech exercise sports science program. Floyd, who started in 46 games at catcher in 2015, was recognized as the highest-ranking graduate in the ESS program as part of the commencement ceremonies. Floyd was honored late in the 2015 season on the Academic All-Big 12 first team where he was the only conference student-athlete nominated with a perfect 4.0 GPA.

Tim Tadlock, the 2014 College Baseball Hall of Fame National Coach of the Year, enters his fourth season as the head coach at Texas Tech after taking the Red Raiders to the College World Series in just his second season while winning over 100 games in his tenure.

Tadlock was named head coach of his alma mater on June 8, 2012, becoming the ninth head coach in program history. Tadlock will enter his 24th year in collegiate baseball in 2016. He owns a collegiate career record of 556-209 in 12 years as a head coach with nine seasons at Grayson County College (435-127) and three at Texas Tech (122-82).

Tadlock and the Red Raiders completed the biggest turnaround in school history and the second biggest turnaround in Big 12 history, going from 26 wins in 2013 to 45 wins in 2014. The season culminated with Texas Tech's first trip to the College World Series in Omaha.

Tadlock was named the ABCA Midwest Region Coach of the Year as well as the Skip Bertman National Coach of the Year while guiding the Red Raiders to their best season in school history with a 45-21 overall mark and 14-10 Big 12 record.

Tech finished 31-24 overall in Tadlock's third season in 2015, marking the first time since 2005-06 where the Red Raiders have posted consecutive 30-win seasons. The Red Raiders completed Big 12 play at 13-11 overall, securing a tie for third place in the conference standings, Tech's highest finish since the 2004 season. It was also the second-straight season where Tech has finished among the top four in the Big 12 standings, a first for the Red Raiders since the 2001 and 2002 seasons.

Tadlock returned to his alma mater for the 2012 season as the program's associate head coach and recruiting coordinator following six successful seasons as an assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at Oklahoma. Tadlock produced several of the nation's top recruiting classes while at Oklahoma, helping lead the Sooners back to the College World Series in 2010, the Sooners first trip to Omaha since 1995.

After beginning his college coaching career as an assistant at Hill College (1993-96) for four seasons, Tadlock became the head coach at Grayson County Junior College, where he led the Vikings to back-to-back National Junior College Athletic Association World Series titles in 1999 and 2000. During his nine seasons at Grayson, Tadlock posted a 435-127 (.774) overall record while being named National Coach of the Year following both title runs (1999-2000).

After a prep career at Denton High School and two years at Hill College, Tadlock was a two-year starting shortstop for the Red Raiders where he helped lead Texas Tech to its first-ever 40-win season as a senior in 1991 (42-18). Tadlock graduated with his bachelor's degree in physical education from Texas Tech in May 1992. He also earned a master's degree in education in August 1994 from the University of Texas at Tyler.

Tadlock and his wife, Kelly, have two children, daughter, Chloe (14), and son, Benjamin (12).

2016 AT A GLANCE

Erikson Lanning will be making his fourth start of the season Tuesday afternoon against UNLV. The southpaw is currently 1-2 this season with a 7.47 ERA as he has totaled 15.2 innings in his four appearances, one of which that has come from the bullpen. Lanning picked up his first career win in his collegiate debut as he allowed just one hit, a walk and a hit-by-pitch over six shutout innings on Feb. 21 against Milwaukee. Milwaukee finished with just two hits off the Tech pitching staff, marking the second consecutive two-hitter tossed by the Red Raiders. Tech had not previously recorded back-to-back two hit outings against an opponent dating back to the 2001 season. The impressive debut marked the first time a Red Raider had earned the win and combined on a shutout in his first collegiate start since Matt Withrow helped Tech trounce Northern Illinois, 13-0, on Feb. 17, 2013.

LAST TIME OUT

Lanning came on in relief in his last appearance as the left-hander tossed 1.2 innings out of the bullpen against New Mexico (March 22). He surrendered four runs off four hits in a no-decision. His most-recent start came March 11 when he pitched four innings in the series opener against No. 9 California. Lanning surrendered eight runs off eight hits and two strikeouts in a losing effort.

LANNING RETURNS TO TEXAS FOR COLLEGE CAREER

Lanning's selection of Texas Tech as a college destination is a return to the Lone Star State for the left-hander. Lanning, who grew up most of his life in the Dallas-Fort Worth area, moved to Woodstock, Georgia, prior to his junior year of high school. The southpaw was recruited heavily by several east coast schools before ultimately choosing Texas Tech.

LANNING, HARPENAU BECOME FIRST FRESHMEN PAIR TO START OPENING WEEKEND

Ty Harpenau and Erikson Lanning became the first pair of freshmen to start in two of the first four games of a season dating back to the 2001 season. Harpenau received the ball in the first game of a Feb. 21 doubleheader against Milwaukee before Lanning closed the four-game set the following day.

2016 AT A GLANCE

Ty Damron will be making his team-leading seventh start of the season and 19th of his career Wednesday night at Florida State. Damron improved to 2-1 last week with the win against UNLV as he has totaled a 6.04 ERA over 22.1 innings this season. Damron has allowed four or fewer hits in five of his six starts this season, limiting opponents to a .258 average against the left-hander, the lowest clip of his career. Texas Tech is a combined 4-2 this season in Damron's six starts.

LAST TIME OUT

Damron earned his second win of the season last Tuesday in Texas Tech's 14-6 victory at UNLV. Damron tossed five innings in the win where he allowed three runs off four hits, five walks and a season-high six strikeouts. His six strikeouts were one shy of his career high that was set on April 28 last year against Grand Canyon. The victory was Damron's first since moving to the midweek rotation prior to Texas Tech's neutral-site contest against UT Arlington on March 15.

DAMRON BEGINS SEASON WITH TWO-HITTER AGAINST MILWAUKEE

Damron began his season by combining on a two-hitter in the second game of a Feb. 20 double-header against Milwaukee. Damron allowed just an unearned run off one hit and four strikeouts in the 9-1 victory which was followed by another two-hitter the following day to conclude the Milwaukee series. Texas Tech had not previously tossed consecutive two-hitters dating back to the start of the 2001 season.

DAMRON LEADS ACTIVE RED RAIDERS IN CAREER WINS

Damron enters Monday's start at UNLV with a share of the team high in career wins as the junior is 7-3 over his two-plus seasons as a Red Raider. Damron, who has made 17 starts during his career, is tied with fellow junior Ryan Moseley for the team high in career wns. The southpaw has compiled a 4.34 ERA during that span after allowing just 40 earned runs in his 83.0 innings.

AVOIDING THE LONG BALL

In his 83.0 innings as a Red Raider, Damron has notoriously avoided the home run ball. In fact, the junior has allowed just two home runs during his career despite facing 405 batters entering his start Tuesday against UT Arlington.

DAMRON IN THE MLB DRAFT

Damron was the highest selected pitcher by the Los Angeles Dodgers in 2013 as the left-hander was drafted in the 13th round. Damron is one of five Red Raiders on the 2016 roster who has been drafted previously by a MLB organization.
