
MAFCA

Question: Why is Thanksgiving always on a Thursday?

Answer: Thursday seems to have evolved first as tradition, then as a matter of national law. We don't know for sure which day of the week the Pilgrims' famous first Thanksgiving actually occurred, for instance. That Thanksgiving, interestingly, took place in mid-October, not November. For a brief time beginning in 1668, November 25 was considered the "legal" annual day of Thanksgiving, but that practice lasted only five years. It may be that Thursday became tradition in order to distance the event from the Sabbath day among the Puritan colonists. Thursday was also a typical day for lectures in New England, with ministers giving a religious talk each Thursday afternoon. This practice may have contributed to the Thursday Thanksgiving tradition. Since George Washington's time, Thursday has been the day, and this was solidified by Abraham Lincoln's proclamation in 1863 designating the national day of Thanksgiving to be the last Thursday of November. Later that was amended to the fourth Thursday in November. It's important here to note that neither Lincoln, nor anyone else, ever declared the Friday after Thanksgiving as the national day of shopping.

Tours

We returned to the hotel in time to watch the Royals play off game on TV. The hotel folks let us use the breakfast area to watch the game together.

Thursday we took a scenic route to the College of the Ozarks to tour the Ralph Foster Museum, an eclectic collection of items from dolls to guns. The gun exhibit is one of the largest and best I've seen. At the Keeter Center, we bought sandwiches and ate outside overlooking the beautiful campus of the college. Everyone had a free afternoon to shop, see a show, or visit other attractions. Ron and I decided to take a nice drive the back way through Forsyth back into Branson. Back in Branson, we stopped at the Grand Palace Shoppes where I purchased some ornaments at the Kris Kringle Store. After shopping we stopped at Mel's Diner and had a humongous scoop of ice cream. Storms rumbled through that evening, the only rain we had on the trip.

Friday we left Branson taking MO 13 north back up through Springfield to Clinton. We made it to Clinton by lunchtime after making a stop at the Osceola Cheese store. I think everyone bought snacks or cheese. We regrouped after lunch to tour a restored DX Service Station owned by G.L. Lowe. We also enjoyed ice cream sundaes in his wife's, Martha, restored ice cream shop at the rear of the station. After the station tour we drove a few blocks to the Downtown DeSoto Museum. We had a nice tour of Jim Raysik's car collection. As we were leaving, Larry McDonald had a flat tire which of course meant everyone else had to help. Making quick work of changing the tire, we drove to the Hampton Inn and checked in for the night. Dinner was at a good BBQ place and after dinner we commandeered the breakfast area to watch the Royals. It was a great day.

Friday morning we got up, checked out of the hotel and drove over to the Buck Harness Collection. Housed in a barn on his property, it's a great collection of early 20th Century vehicles and memorabilia. The next tour of the morning was to the Henry County Museum. For a small town museum, it was a really nicely laid out museum. Our guide was quite informative about Clinton and the area. Leaving Clinton after lunch, we split off at Harrisonville for points north and west towards home. We made a stop in Eudora for Pam Ebert's visitation and to give our condolences to Doug. We made it home in time for dinner, ending another great tour.
