

#### A RECIPE FROM....

#### Texas Sheet Cake

2 sticks butter

1 c. water

4 Tbsp. cocoa

2 c. flour 2 c. sugar

2 eggs ½ c. sour cream

1 tsp. baking soda ½ tsp. salt

In a saucepan bring to boil the first 3 ingredients and remove from heat. Then add remaining ingredients and mix well. Pour into a large greased cookie sheet and bake at  $350\,^\circ$  for  $22\,$  minutes. Frost with Texas Sheet Cake Frosting while still warm.

#### FROSTING:

1 stick butter 1 lb. confectioner's sugar

6 Tbsp. milk 1 c. chopped nuts 4 Tbsp. Cocoa 1 tsp. vanilla

Bring to a boil first 3 ingredients; remove from heat and add last 3 ingredients. Spread on cake while still warm.







The old man replied, "Oh, I haven't told my family yet. I just sit around and list en to their conversations. I've changed my will three times."


