## Children's Foundation in Church – **Our Future Leaders**

As we explore various ways that children impact our lives, one of the most important ways is involving them in the worship service. I firmly believe that as Christians, we should actively seek to minister to children in and outside of church. Leaders in the church should make it a priority to teach God's Word to children. They like to participate in many activities, and if we include them in service, they can experience the attitude of servanthood and leadership in the church.

Thinking about my own personal childhood experiences in church, I believe that young children can serve as part of the church. The church my family belonged to went to the local nursing home once a month on a Sunday morning to have church with the residents there. My mom went on these Sundays, and as a six year old, I went with her to help at the nursing home. What a joy it was to be able to help push the residents in their wheelchairs to the activity room where they had their worship service, or sometimes just to sit and hold their hands. If our church wants to reach out to the community, why not include young children to help serve the community?

I have been serving at Speedway Christian Church for three months, and am thrilled to see that we have a vibrant children's program. Just a few weeks ago, the children participated in worship with an anthem, and it was marvelous to see how many were singing. When they can be a part of glorifying Christ with music, they are serving. If the church invites children from the community, this can lead them to learning God's message, which may be their first and only exposure to the path of salvation. We see the importance of children to Jesus in Matthew 19:13-15, "Then little children were brought to Jesus for him to place his hands on them and pray for them. But the disciples rebuked those who brought them. Jesus said, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these.' When he had placed his hands on them, he went on from there."

## Thinking Out Loud...

"How My Mind Has Changed" is a series of ongoing articles that has appeared in the publication *The Christian Century* for eighty or so years. The articles are usually a few pages long, and they are written with much candor by well-known, great Christian thinkers. They talk about how they "used to think" and how that has evolved through the years. Their minds have changed, because of new insights. These have been prompted by experiences and by exposure to new ways of seeing things, particularly new ways of seeing what it means to be a follower of Jesus Christ.

How has your mind changed? I'm sure that all of us can say, "I used to believe (fill in blank), but now I believe (fill in the blank)." We can say that we have changed, because the Christian life is a process. We never arrive in the Promised Land; we are always journeying toward it. We don't grasp the truth once and for all with no need ever to change. Even Jesus was always in the process of discovering new insights. Luke 2: 52 says, "And Jesus increased in wisdom and in years, and in divine and human favor."

One of the things that strikes me in *The Christian Century* articles is that those who speak of their minds changing have not just had a shift in their thinking. It has been a process of deepening their relationship with God. It has meant a change at the center of their souls. They have been in the process of what the apostle Paul describes as becoming a new creation (2 Corinthians 5:17).

Have you been in the process of becoming a new creation? In John 3, Jesus tells Nicodemus that he needs to be born again or born from above. Some see this as a one time transaction in which a person's life suddenly shifts courses 180°. I tend to think that the Christian life is one of ongoing conversion. There is a sense in which we have to be born again or born from above every day, and even in the course of each day.

I see the Christian life as one of ups and downs, filled with many detours and surprises in the course of the journey. It's an exciting journey, because we travel in the company of God and we travel with others who are also on the journey. We don't travel alone.

Take time to reflect on your life as I reflect on mine. If we haven't been and still aren't evolving in our relationship with God, we need to do some serious evaluating, because God is always trying to nudge us in new directions so that we might become more of the person God wants to continue to create us to be.

## Catch the Vision: Give so It Lives! **October 25 Congregational Meeting Summary**

More than 60 interested church members met October 25 between services for information and O and A on the church's proposed 2016 general operating budget of \$499,855.

Moderator David Shank, Stewardship & Finance Chair Alice McColgin and stewardship campaign team member Roy Shoemaker emphasized the importance of increasing overall giving commitments by five percent to fully fund realistic programs, ministries, facility and personnel. The good news is our giving has increased eight percent over last year, and this is truly something to celebrate!

But if you've followed the stewardship reports this year you know our expenses have continued to outpace our income. Major repairs are being made to the building's stonework and the roof on both the sanctuary and education wing.

During 2015 staff and lay leaders have spent little on programs and ministries but accomplished much by using creative ways to do God's work in our community and beyond:

- Added 26 new members
- Sunday evening Youth Groups have 50 kids participating from nine different schools
- Increased support to St. John's Storehouse programs
- Funded 28 church camp scholarships with a special fundraiser

• Provided strong worship services and activities for our members and the greater community. Pastoral care calls and visitation to homebound members, the hospitalized, grieving and people searching for faith and forgiveness

#### It's critical to remember an increase of five percent in giving by our congregation will allow the departments and programs of our church to:

• Expand outreach programs to provide more food, basic beds and bedding for local families

• Provide additional opportunities for our children and youth ministries

• Buy new study materials and learning tools for Christian education

• Reinstate some personnel benefits
