### APPLICATION

# **Registration Requirements**

All of the following items are required in order for your registration to be complete. We apologize for any inconvenience the additional documentation adds. It is required due to our government funding, which enables us to keep your costs low.

- Complete Application Packet (6 Pages) for each participant
- o \$50 Registration Fee for each participant
- Proof of Residency for primary Parent/Guardian (ex: Photo ID or check stub with proper Address, utility bill or mortgage/rent which lists address)
- Copies of photo IDs for all household members over the age of 18
- Copies of Social Security card for all household members over the age of 6
- Proof of all household income for persons over the age of 18 (ex: 2 months current and consecutive check stubs, signed letter from employer on company letterhead, TANF records, food stamps, free and reduced lunch verification)
- If there is no-income in the household or social security documentation is missing, you must complete a notarized Self-Certification form. Self-Certification forms are available at Girls Inc. and a staff member is available to notarize documents Monday-Friday 2:30pm-6:00pm.

# Your registration is not complete and your spot will not be held until we have received your completed application packet and your registration fee, this includes ALL supporting documentation.

You may pay your registration fee in cash, money order, check, debit card, or credit card in person or through PayPal on our website at <u>www.girlsincatl.org</u>.

Please note that when you register you are committing to pay for all weeks of Girls Inc. University you are registered for unless changes are made well before camp starts (please see payment policies for details). When you register for a week of camp we hold your child's space and turn other girls away so even if your child is later unable to attend you are still responsible for payment.

In addition, a parent/guardian for each participant is required to attend the mandatory parent orientation Thursday, June, 2<sup>nd</sup> 6pm-8pm.

### In Person Registration & Tours

The best time to drop off registration packets in person is at our **front desk between 2:30pm and 6pm** on days when Cobb County Schools are open. This will also be when we are able to notarize documents if necessary. You may also drop them off to our admin staff in the mornings however we cannot guarantee there will always be someone in the office during other hours.

If you would like to meet our staff and see our facility before you register, we would love to show you around. However, due to our other programming we may not always have someone available to do this. Please understand we always prioritize the girls currently in our care.

If you would like a tour and to discuss our programs in person, we recommend scheduling a tour in advance, by emailing either Molly Friesenborg at <u>mfriesenborg@girlsincatl.org</u> or Michelle Graves at <u>mgraves@girlsincatl.org</u>. We will also try to have someone available Monday from 5pm-6pm and Wednesday from 11:30-1:30 and 5pm-6pm, but due to programming constraints this cannot be guaranteed.

### Waitlist

There will be 5 groups at Girls Inc. University:

- Freshman Rising 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade;
- Sophomores Rising 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Grade;
- Juniors Rising 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> Grade;
- Seniors Rising 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> Grade;
- Grads Rising High School Students.

Each age-group will have no more than 20 participants to ensure high quality programming. This means Girls Inc. University will fill quickly! If your participants' age group is filled, you will be placed on a waiting list. Because you can register by the week, you may be admitted some weeks but not other weeks. We do require your registration fee to place you on the waiting list. However, the fee will be returned in full if we are not able to accommodate your child at Girls Inc. University.

# **Programming Schedule**

The summer schedule may vary from day to day as we work to fit in many special activities for the girls. You will receive a specific schedule for your child's group at parent orientation. However, while girls are at the Girls Inc. center they will generally have the same daily schedule as follows:

7:00am	<b>Informal Time</b> –Time for girls to make their own choices from a variety of activity stations or gym time, during this time girls of all age groups will be together
8:00am	<b>Wellness/Informal Time</b> – Three times a week at 8am we will have structured wellness activities to begin our day with physical activity! Parents are welcome to join us for morning exercise before beginning your day as well! Days without wellness activities will be continued informal time.
9:00am	<b>Home Room</b> – Time each morning to check in with the girls in their age groups, review what they've learned, and make announcements for the day. <i>All girls are expected to arrive by 9am!</i>
9:30am	<b>Literacy/College Readiness Time</b> – For our younger groups this time will focus on literacy skills, to keep skills strong over the summer so they are prepared when they return to school. We will be reinforcing literacy skills through games and interactive activities. For older girls this time will be focused on age appropriate college and career preparation activities. This may include creating college and career road maps, working on building community service resumes or looking at available scholarships.
10:30am	<b>Major Activity</b> – During Major Activities girls will explore the careers from our weekly University Majors. These activities will include hearing from guest speakers working in these professions and trying out what a career in this field may be like such as starting their own business during entrepreneurship week or running their own café.
12:00pm	<b>Lunch</b> – Lunch will be provided daily though you may pack lunch if you prefer or have special dietary restrictions.
12:30pm	Informal Time – Girls will have another period of informal time after lunch.
1:20pm	Major Activity – Girls will participate in a second Major Activity in the afternoon.
2:20pm	<b>STEM</b> – While we will be exploring many career field throughout the summer, Girls Inc. believes exposing girls to careers in <b>S</b> cience, <b>T</b> echnology, <b>E</b> ngineering and <b>M</b> ath is especially important as these are some of the best career opportunities for their future. During STEM time girls will work with a variety of STEM professionals to learn about the many opportunities in STEM from Water Management to Building Apps.
3:50pm	Snack Time – Snack will be provided daily.
4:20pm	<b>Home Room</b> – At the end of each day this will be a brief time to unwind and reflect on the day. <i>Please</i> do not pick up girls until 5pm.
5:00pm	<b>Wellness/Informal Time</b> – Two times a week at 5pm we will have structured wellness activities to end our day with physical activity! Parents are welcome and encouraged to join us for afternoon exercise before heading home! Days without wellness activities will be informal time.
6:00pm	Center Closes – All girls must be picked up by this time.

In addition some activities will be scheduled on a weekly basis including weekly field trips, skating and swimming, which will vary for each group as the schedule shows below.

### Attendance

Girls Inc. University hours are from 7:00AM to 6:00PM. Girls will not be allowed to be dropped off early even if staff are present in the building as this prevents staff from preparing for the day. All girls are to be picked up by 6:00PM or late pick up fees will be assessed.

Our primary program hours are between 9:00 AM and 5:00 PM. The hours from 7:00 AM to 9:00 AM and 5:00 PM to 6:00 PM are considered before and after-care and will be informal/wellness activities. Please remember parents are encouraged to join us for wellness activities!

We request that participants arrive by 9:00 AM and are picked up after 5:00 PM to take full advantage of our program. Participants arriving after 9:00 AM on non-field trip days will still be able to join programming as long as this is not a consistent occurrence, as late arrival is very disruptive to programming. If this is consistent, after discussions with parents, participants may not be admitted after 9:00 AM.

Unfortunately, girls arriving after their group has left on a field trip will not be able to attend that day, we are not able to delay field trips for tardy participants. Some field trips may be required to leave earlier than 9:00am; this will be communicated with parents in the detailed schedule available at parent orientation. We will do our best to return from all field trips by 5:00PM however there may be some instances where traffic or other unforeseen issues will force field trips return late. In addition, please remember that on swimming days your child may not be available for pick up until 5:15PM or so due to time getting back from the pool and changing.

Parents/Guardians or authorized pick-ups are required to **come in the building and sign participants in and out of camp** each day. You are not allowed to simply drop participants off in the parking lot. Only people listed in this packet will be allowed to pick up the participant, and people picking up girls will be asked to show ID.

You are responsible for informing us if your participant will be absent on any given day. Please **call and inform Girls Inc. of absences no later than 9:00 AM**. This is especially important for field trip days.

### **Illness and Medication**

**Girls Inc. is not equipped to care for sick children.** All Girls Inc. Program Facilitators are First Aid and CPR certified, however they have no other medical training. If a girl is unable to participate in the normal routine, the parent/guardian will be called and must come pick up the child. If a primary parent/guardian cannot be reached, Girls Inc. will contact alternate contacts provided for pick-up. Participants are not allowed to come to Girls Inc. University if they currently have or, in the last 24 hours, have had a 1) fever greater than 100 degrees, 2) diarrhea or vomiting, 3) a contagious rash or illness, 4) obvious pain or discomfort and/or 5) head lice and pink eye. Some contagious ailments such as pink eye may require a doctor's notice that your child is no longer contagious to return to Girls Inc.

While possible please give medications outside of camp hours. **Any medications girls must take while at camp must have written directions and signed authorization from a parent/guardian.** Medication must be in its original container with an unaltered label containing the child's name and the date. Medication will be kept with staff at all times in the groups emergency bag.

### **Behavior**

Girls Inc. promotes self-discipline and works to create rules and structure that help each girl feel safe and secure while ensuring all girls show respect to each other, staff, volunteers and property. We also try to focus on incentives for positive behavior. When participants break rules, they are reminded of the expectations at Girls Inc. and discuss their behavior with staff, or take a short time away to calm down. Often this is all that is necessary.

Participants can also be given consequences designed to change future behavior such as writing down what they could do differently next time. Behavior issues on field trips may result in not being able to participate in future field trips as field trip environments often pose more risk. For behavioral issues a white slip will be sent home to parents to inform them of the issue and what is being done to address it. For repeated or more severe behavior issues a pink slip will be sent home. *If the behavior continues beyond this point, or if at any time a participant's behavior prevents other girls from receiving high quality programming, causes significant damage to or puts themselves, other participants, staff, or volunteers at risk, Girls Inc. of Greater Atlanta withholds the right to dismiss a participant from the program.* 

### **Evaluation**

Girls Inc. of Greater Atlanta is dedicated to providing high quality, intentional programming that moves girls forward to become strong, smart and bold women. To continue improving our programming to meet these goals, we utilize a number of different tools to evaluate the effectiveness of our programs. In addition, information from these evaluations is used to secure additional funding for our programs which help keep costs low for our parents.

These tools include, but are not limited to, summer pre and post-surveys taken by participants to measure content knowledge such as a survey of career opportunities that measures the effectiveness of Girls Inc. University career exploration and literacy tests that measure how effectively our program combats summer learning loss. These outcomes may also be measured by collecting materials produced by girls over the course of the summer. In addition, our staff will make observations regarding participants' skills, attitudes and knowledge and how they change over time. All evaluation materials, such as surveys, will be kept confidential. Any reporting done will be at the group level (i.e. 80% of girls...). Individual results will not be shared.

### **Belongings & Coming Prepared for the Day**

Participants are expected to come prepared for all activities that take place during Girls Inc. University. This means they need to wear comfortable clothes and shoes that they can move in. **Please do not wear any shoes that girls cannot run and play in, including teens!** Participants will not be allowed to remove shoes for activities, and if they are not appropriately dressed, they will not get to participate. Participants must bring items for special activities such as a swimsuit and towel on swim days and socks on skating days. Girls may also have days they will need to dress up due to field trips in a business setting. All girls must wear their Girls Inc. shirt when they are leaving the building on a field trip. We are not able to accommodate participants calling on a regular basis to request items they have forgotten. Participants are responsible for all items they bring to camp. Girls Inc. of Greater Atlanta is not responsible for any lost or stolen items including, but not limited, to money or electronics.

### **Payment Policies**

**Registration Fee: The registration Fee of \$50 is non-refundable.** However, it will be waived if *all* weekly tuition for summer camp is paid on or before June 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2016, the date of parent orientation.

**Tuition Responsibilities:** By completing this registration packet you are agreeing to pay weekly tuition for all weeks you have registered for. You will not be held responsible for weekly tuition ONLY if you notify Girls Inc. that the participant will not be attending ON or BEFORE MAY 15, 2016 AND we are able to fill that spot with another participant. After May 15<sup>th</sup>, **you will be required to pay for all weeks you have registered for even if your participant does not attend.** There will be no tuition refunds if a participant does not attend due to illness, transportation issues, or other unforeseen circumstances. Refunds will also not be issued if the participant is dismissed due to behavior.

**Late Payments: Weekly tuition is due one full week in advance.** With the exception of the first week which is due at parent orientation. For instance, tuition for week two of camp (June 13<sup>th</sup>-17<sup>th</sup>) is due no later than Monday morning of week one (June 6<sup>th</sup>). A \$3 per day late fee will be charged if the payment is made late. For instance, if week two tuition is paid on June 13th, you will also be charged a \$15 late fee. The participant will not be allowed to be dropped off if that week's tuition payment has not been made.

**Returned Checks:** If a check you have written for program fees is returned from the bank unpaid, **you will be charged a \$25 returned check fee**. This fee will be due within one week of notification. In addition, we will require you to make all payments to Girls Inc. through cash, money order or cashier's check for six months following the returned personal check.

**Late Pick-up:** Girls Inc. University closes at 6:00 PM. Late pickup fees begin to accrue at 6:05 PM, after which you will be assessed a fee of \$1.00 for every minute you are late. Late pickup fees are due within one week of when they are incurred. In the event of consistent late pick-ups, or extremely late pick-ups Girls Inc. reserves the right to increase fees or even dismiss participants from the program.
