If you are willing, when you receive a telephone call, to stop what you are doing and pray for one in need, please sign up in the narthex or the church office for this new ministry.




CHOIR NEWS

Lent Devotion Books

Lent is the name given by the church to the 40 days (plus seven Sundays) leading up to the resurrection of Jesus. Traditionally, Lent is a time for penitence – a time to consider our misdeeds and to seek God's forgiveness for them. Often people chose to give up something during Lent but I would like to ask you to do something extra during Lent: take on the spiritual discipline of daily Scripture reading, reflection, and prayer. We

have special Lenten devotional booklets that are available around the church. In this booklet, you will find readings for each day of the Lenten season, from Ash Wednesday through Easter. The theme of this year is "While Still Far Off." It is based on the Parable of the Prodigal Son, Luke 15:11-32. Throughput the reflections, you will see the phrase "prevenient grace." That's what we call God's grace that "comes before" any action on our part. It means that, like the father in the parable, God reaches out to us when we are lost, loving us is spite of ourselves and longing for us to come home. Another way of saying this is that God loves us "first, best, and most."

Wednesday Family Night





This prayer, delivered by Brad Smith in 1990, gave birth to an idea. Why not use the Super Bowl weekend to unify the nation for a higher good: collecting dollars and canned goods for the needy? Since 1990 young people across the country have collected over \$70 million for soup kitchens, food banks, and other charities in communities. Every dollar collected is donated.

On Sunday, February 7th, our youth will be standing at the doors of the church to collect a dollar or more from you as you leave. Please help support this worthwhile youth led program.



A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Members & Friends,

The February newsletter is running a little late, and I am the one to blame! It's been harder than usual trying to figure out what to say. Melinda and I have been overwhelmed by the caring and supportive words from so many people after sharing the news that we will soon be moving to Hot Springs, AR. This new reality is at the same time saddening, exciting, and mildly terrifying!

I speak for Melinda and our children when I say that all of you at FPC have meant the world to us during our life here. It has been such a blessing to call Hernando home. And in many ways this place and this church will always be home to us. We are grateful for the plans to share a meal together with this church family on February 14th. I think it is fitting for Valentine's Day to be my last Sunday with First Presbyterian Church, for we have certainly shared much love together, and we always will!

I want to say a few words about what to expect during the next few months. Members of the session have already been in touch with members of St. Andrew Presbytery, the regional church council headquartered near Camp Hopewell at Oxford. Presbytery will consult with the session in the days ahead to provide FPC with an *interim pastor* for a few months. We will learn who that pastor will be in the next week or so.

There will be worship every Sunday as usual, along with Sunday school, Wednesday night supper and study program, PYF, UFO, Presbyterian Women, and all of our regular programs. The interim pastor will preach, lead worship, and perform pastoral duties for the church. The Session will still be responsible, as they have always been, for managing and maintaining the ongoing life of this congregation. The presbytery will play a supportive role for them and the interim pastor.

As the interim pastor and session lead the church over the next months, they will begin preparing for a longer-term interim pastor known as a *transitional pastor*, one who is trained in leading churches through periods between permanent pastoral relationships. It's likely that the session will have a transitional pastor in place sometime this summer. The transitional pastor will work

with the session to come up with a slate of nominees for a <u>Pastor Nominating Committee</u> (PNC) who will begin the work of preparing for the next pastor of First Presbyterian Church of Hernando.

After their election the PNC members will work closely with the session and the presbytery as they develop a *Ministry Information Form* (MIF), which tells the story of FPC and the kind of pastor the church is looking for. There will likely be a congregation-wide *mission study* to help the PNC develop the MIF. Your input will be vital; there is no shortcut for this process, and the church will learn much about itself and God's call as the process unfolds.

The PNC will need the prayers and goodwill of the whole congregation as they work with the session and presbytery to understand who God is calling to be the next pastor of FPC-Hernando. When that day comes you will all be very happy, and I am sure all will say the next pastor was worth the wait! The process could easily take a year, and it probably should, considering how long I've hung around here!

I am already praying for God's will to be clearly revealed. I am praying for current session members, the interim pastor, the transitional pastor (whoever he/she may be!), and the Pastor Nominating Committee (whoever they may be). I'm praying for good communication between FPC and St. Andrew presbytery as this process unfolds. And I am confident that the Lord will bring FPC and her next pastor together in much the same way that I was brought here 25 years ago. One day you will be telling your friends, "You will love our church's new pastor!"
