#### **Career Day at Warren Elementary**

n April 7th, 4th and 5th graders will participate in a Career Speakers Series here at our school. We are excited to welcome many different speakers to share information about their careers. Speakers will bring real world experiences to our students to help them see the diversity of opportunities in today's job market. Students have been investigating career clusters this year in classroom guidance lessons. Soon we will be matching possible clusters to their likes and dislikes. Research shows that it is important for students at the elementary school age to be exposed to the many career possibilities, as well as to begin

understanding their own areas of interest. Without exploration, students tend to limit themselves to careers they are familiar with, whether or not it is a fit. Additionally, students often feel a greater connection to learning when they understand how it can impact their future possibilities.

During that week, Kindergarten, 1st grade, 2nd grade and 3rd grade teachers are inviting parents into their classrooms to discuss their careers with the students. Please contact your child's teacher if you would be interested in speaking to your child's class during career week.

We are also emphasizing the importance of college and career training while we are exploring jobs and the future. Please discuss your jobs and your college experience with your children. It will make them more enthusiastic about education and the link to their dreams and futures.

Students and adults who are respectful follow rules and directions, and this helps them to be successful in work, school, with friends, in sports and in all aspects of life. Respectful students do not talk back or call out when teachers or parents are speaking to them. This helps them to learn and be successful. This quality of listening is extremely important in friendships and getting along with others as well. It is very sad when children do not have friends. It can be extremely frustrating and lonely for a child, who has troubles with friendships throughout life, because he or she has never understood the importance of listening to the other person.

Let's work together to help our children be as successful as they can be at Warren Elementary and throughout life by teaching respect and modeling this character trait in all that we do this month and every month.

## Health Suite News

#### **HEAD LICE**

since <u>head lice</u> is a common occurrence, especially in elementary school, it is a good practice to examine your child's head weekly to make sure he/she does not have head lice. The following signs indicate that the condition **may** be present.

- Persistent itching of the scalp
- An insect about 1/8 inch long in the hair, usually found underneath the top layer of hair
- Tan or white nits (eggs) approximately the size if a flake of dandruff and firmly attached to the hair shaft.

Please remind students not to share hats, combs, brushes, and hair ornaments or sports helmets. It is also a good idea for students with long hair to keep it tied back or braided to minimize the chance of exposure. The School Nurse should be notified if your child has pediculosis.

Thank you for expressing an interest in our
Computer Science Summer Program again this
year. In previous years, we were known as the
MSDE Summer Center for Computer Science and
Creativity for GT students. However, there have been a
few changes over the winter that I would like to bring to
your attention. We are no longer considered an MSDE
Summer Center for Gifted and Talented. We are
completely run through the partnership of Baltimore
County Public Schools, Northrop Grumman, and CCBCEssex. What that means for you is:

- 1. Our name has changed slightly. We are now called BCPS Summer Camp for Computer Science and Innovation.
- 2. ALL students entering grades 3-8 can apply (not just those identified as Gifted and Talented).
- 3. We are hopeful that we will be able to incorporate a few more activities such as using a 3D printer, robotics, etc.
- 4. Hopefully (if I did it correctly), it also means that the application process has been simplified! I am attaching a link to the Google Docs form that we created as our application. It is titled: BCPS Summer Camp for Computer Science and Innovation.

The Computer Science and Innovation Camp is supported by the BCPS Office of Science PreK-12 and the BCPS Office of Advanced Academics. Funding is provided for the program through student tuition and funding received from Northrop Grumman. Taught by two highly qualified BCPS high school teachers, this Summer Camp provides an outstanding opportunity for students around Maryland. Throughout the two week program, students will have opportunities to work independently and collaboratively to learn new ways to be creative through computer programming. Using the medium of computer languages, participants will become the architects of their own virtual worlds. Students will create animations using visual objects and straightforward commands that make programming easier to understand.

Students will exercise their creativity, problem solving, and critical thinking skills while designing a final project to present at the conclusion of the session. The skills they develop provide a useful foundation for learning more advanced programming in languages such as SCRATCH, Java, C++, and/or Python. Students will also learn valuable processes essential to programming. These include everything from the software development cycle to "CamelCase". The program will also emphasize critical executive function skills such as project management, collaboration, and communication. *NEW THIS YEAR*: We are hoping to incorporate 3D printers and robotics into the program.

WHO: All Maryland students entering grades 3<sup>rd</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup>

WHERE: Essex Campus of CCBC, Rosedale, MD

WHEN: Plans are currently being finalized to hold the camp during July 11-22<sup>nd</sup>.

COST: Tuition for this year's summer center is expected to be \$200 for the two week session. Several financial scholarships will be available for qualifying applicants. (Transportation and lunches will not be provided.)
