# **Staying Ahead of** the Curve at UGA

My first year as Chapter Advisor has truly been a great experience. Particularly strong leadership within the chapter. the Alumni Advisory Board, the Minerva Club, Keith, Marvin and Hootie have combined to make my job easy over the past year. However, with ever tightening University policies regarding the Greek system, Georgia Beta must continue to fight to stay ahead of the curve and keep the doors open at 247 Pulaski.

We believe that the two quickest ways to have the doors closed are illegal drug use and hazing. With that in mind, the student leadership, together with the Alumni Advisory Board, has developed a new drug testing policy. In short, the policy is three pronged, requiring (1) pledges to pass a drug test as a condition of initiation; (2) officer candidates to pass a drug test as a condition of eligibility for office; and (3) brothers residing in the house to pass a drug test as a condition of residing in the house. The rationale for choosing these three particular groups is (1) we want to bring only drugfree men into the fraternity as pledges; (2) we want the officers to lead by example; and (3) there is zero tolerance for drug use on the grounds of 247 Pulaski because we want to ensure that

those living in the house are adhering to that policy. We believe that this drug testing policy allows for the right balance by seeking to maintain the long-term viability of the fraternity, and simultaneously being fair to and respectful of a group of 18 to 22 year old men.

Hazing is becoming less and less of an issue as student leadership and all brothers realize that the cost-benefit of hazing never pans out in favor of the hazer. With that said, we continue to stress to all brothers that  $\Sigma AE$  has a zero tolerance policy for hazing. Anyone who is suspected of hazing a pledge will be subject to review by the Judicial and/or Executive Boards and disciplined appropriately.

# Johnny Isakson **Re-elected to Senate**

## Georgia Beta – House Association Update

The Ross Crane house, since its renovation a couple of years ago, continues to be the focal point of our chapter, and the best fraternity house, at the best fraternity at UGA.

As part of the alumni leadership group, the members of the House Association are constantly looking for ways to better support the chapter, and the house itself. We continue to use Parker and Associates for the basic property management needs of the house (monthly inspections, minor repair work, handling of the leases, etc.) To become more efficient in our collection of dues and rent payments, we are moving these functions to OmegaFi, a leading financial services provider for Greek organizations. They handle billing, collections, website management, alumni communications and much more. We strongly feel this move will prove beneficial to the chapter and will improve our finances — cash flow, better collections, less write offs, etc — going forward. We've also hired OmegaFi to help us oversee our alumni communications including mailing lists, newsletters, websites and annual dues collections.

We are very fortunate to have a tenured and responsible staff in place. In fact, other fraternities have approached members of our staff about leaving  $\Sigma AE$ , but so far all have decided to stay with us, which speaks volumes about our chapter members, and the work environment we have at 247 Pulaski Street. We truly appreciate the efforts of Keith, Marvin and Hootie!

Finally, we are pleased to report we have two key new alumni volunteers in place. **Oliver Pryor '07** assumed the role of Chapter Adviser in June, and **Warren Pope '95** stepped into the Chapter Counsel position in August. Both Pryor and Pope are former Eminent Archons. Pryor is a second year law/MBA student in Athens, where he wishes to practice after graduation. Pope is a partner with King & Spalding in Atlanta.

We all must extend great thanks to Pryor and Pope's predecessors for their extraordinary service to the chapter, **Milton Eisenberg '86** and **Mat Presnell '97** as Chapter Advisers and **Walt Hays '90** as Counsel.

It would be very compelling to feature any one of the past three Presidents of the University of Georgia's Arch Foundation, John Spalding '82, Jack Head '75 or Sheffield Hale '83; and while the chapter could have highlighted the current UGA Alumni Association President, Vic Sullivan '80 or the present Chair of the UGA Foundation, Sam Holmes '87, Georgia Beta chose to profile **Darren Ash '81** of Charlotte. Ash was recently awarded "Charlotte's 2010 Community Leader of the Year."

Ash has served since March 2007 as the Director and Founder of an innovative supportive housing solution for homeless families in Charlotte called W.I.S.H. (Workforce Initiative for Supportive Housing). W.I.S.H. takes homeless working

families with children directly from the shelters and places them in quality vacant apartments with a full array of wrap-around supportive services including Master's level social workers and volunteer Hope Teams. Existing agencies (Crisis Assistance Ministry, Lutheran Family Services, Goodwill Industries and Mecklenburg Co. DSS) all work in a unique collaboration to execute the W.I.S.H. Program and its sister program, Project HOPE. The City of Charlotte has called W.I.S.H. the most collaborative initiative in Charlotte in 30 years. Thanks to Ash's vision and leadership, W.I.S.H. currently houses and serves over 400 household members (including 250 children, all formerly homeless). For more information on W.I.S.H. visit their website at www.wishprogram.org. Prior to W.I.S.H., Ash was a

*(continued from page 4)* founding partner of Apartment Realty Advisors, the second largest apartment investment sales company in the nation. He sold his business interest in ARA almost four years ago to devote full-time efforts toward running the W.I.S.H. Program as its "unpaid" Director. He has served on eight homeless boards in Charlotte

over the past 13 years, and has served on the steering committees of the Mecklenburg County 10 Year Plan to End Homelessness and Housing Charlotte 2007. He is currently co-chair of the Charlotte Rescue Mission's \$10 Million capital campaign to expand its facility for addicted homeless women. Ash is married with two Georgia Beta sons **Griffin '11** and **John '13**. His wife, Kathryn (Georgia Beta Little Sister), also graduated from UGA and currently serves on the Arch Foundation Advisory Board and Honors Board. Kathryn and Darren have also endowed scholarships that recognize UGA Honors Program students involved in community service.



# **Campaign for Georgia Beta Update**

Summary as of December 31, 2010

It had been more than 25 years since **John Carswell '54** led a drive to rehabilitate the Ross Crane House and create an active House Corporation and Chapter Codes of Conduct. No significant capital improvements had occurred since that project ended in 1982. Thirty years later, the need for restoration and improvement was imperative; particularly from a systems, safety, and engineering perspective. Accordingly, the Trustees of the House Corporation and the Officers of the Chapter voted unanimously in 2007 to launch a campaign to raise the funds to completely restore the house and grounds.

Thanks to the leadership of Campaign Chairmen, **Jimmy Fluker '63** and **Pierre Howard '65**, and the phenomenal team of alumni volunteers they assembled, Georgia Beta raised nearly \$2 million. Further, through the in-kind contribution of time and talent from local parent, John Barrett, as general contractor and designer, the chapter saved substantial project management dollars.

Georgia Beta offers huge thanks to all who made this five-year campaign a success; most importantly the contributors.
