Dear CHVE Families,

Thanks for filling buckets at CHVE!

Several books have been written about bucket fillers. Carol McCloud wrote a book called Have You Filled a Bucket Today? A Guide to Daily Happiness for Kids. The premise of the book is the idea that we all carry an

invisible bucket that contains our feelings. When our bucket is full, we feel great. When our bucket is empty, we feel sad. A bucket filler is someone who says or does nice things for other people. By doing this, s/he is filling other people's buckets and filling her/his own bucket at the same time. On the other hand, a bucket dipper says or does things to cause other people to feel bad. A bucket dipper empties her/his bucket when they say and do mean things.

Let's continue to educate our students in an effort to prevent bucket dipping behaviors such as cyber bullying and cruelty to peers. "You're ugly. You're fat. You're stupid. That's gay." These words are damaging. Join the stand against the derisive use of the words "retard" and "retarded" in everyday language and encourage inclusion of those with disabilities. Let's help our students understand how words can strike at the most vulnerable parts of a child's psyche that is still developing and can do irreparable harm. Help students think of ways to end this kind of language.

You, as a parent, friend, teacher, coach, community member, or relative can have a dramatic effect on those closest to you by demonstrating kindness and acceptance of others' differences. Also, by standing up and advocating for those who are treated poorly or differently because of who they are, you are sending the message to all those around you — including those harmed — that everyone deserves respect and that diversity should be celebrated.

Let's teach our children that being a positive bucket filler is a lifestyle choice that will bring joy, and happiness to themselves and the people around them. We are a team cultivating caring community behaviors at CHVE and beyond.
