

#### Tarantula Day at the Library



Rosie the tarantula, courtesy of the Star Eco Station, was the star of the Charlotte's Web kick-off program at the library on Saturday, May 15. Her admiring audience of children and adults learned details about her lifespan (female tarantulas live 20-30 years, while males live 2 years or less), her habitat and her defense mechanisms. Brave attendees were allowed to hold Rosie in the palm of her hand, although she was often larger than the palms of younger hands. Other varieties of tarantulas were also available for observation, along with some baby tarantulas, which are a rare sight. Look forward to more spider-themed activities and another visit from our tarantulas as Culver City Reads Charlotte's Web approaches!

#### July-August-September 2010 Programs at the Culver City Julian Dixon Library

#### Children

(I.) The Summer Reading Program for children, from babies up to teens, offers programs every Wednesday [July 7, 14, 21, 28 and August 4 and 11] at 2:00 p.m. through August 18th. "All performances are made possible in part by the Culver City Performing Arts Grant Program with support from Sony Pictures Entertainment." The theme this year is "Make a Splash, Read @ Your Library!"

Summer Reading Program PARTY! August 18, 2:00-3:00. Games, food, fun, prizes! The grand prize is a bicycle donated by the Culver Westside Dental Group. There will only be one awarded and only those who have completed at least one reading game will be eligible.

- (II.) Bedtime Storytime will continue all summer-long, Tuesdays at 7:00 p.m. for preschool to 8 years old (though, babies and toddlers are also welcome). There is no registration required for this storytime. The storytime on the first Tuesday of the month is provided by the Culver City Friends of the Library.
- (III.) "Summer Storytime for children 5 years and under will be held on Wednesday at 10:00 a.m." There will be no registration for these events. They will begin Wednesday, July 7th and will continue through Wednesday, August 18th. [Toddler and preschool storytime signups will take place again on Tuesday, September 7th (the day after Labor Day) at 10:00 a.m.] Call Joan or Greg B. at 310-559-1676 for details."

#### Teens

(I.) The Teen Summer Reading Program will begin in June and end on Tuesday, August 17<sup>th</sup> with a special event: Bubblemania at 2:00 p.m. Culver Westside Dental Group will also donate a great teen prize this year. As part of the program each Tuesday at 2:00 p.m. the library will host an event such as a paper model-making workshop, screen of *Gum For My Boat*, the story of the Bangladesh Surf Club - the film recently received the Best Short Film at the California Surf Festival. - (I.) The Adult Summer Reading Program will have a kick-off event on Saturday, July 10 at 2:00 p.m. with a panel of local authors discussing their work. The program will run through Saturday, September 4. The cost is free and the program is cosponsored by the Culver City Friends of the Library. There is also an online Adult Summer Reading Program that will be coordinated through the County Library's website [colapublib.org] and customers are welcome to participate in both the in-house and online programs. 
