Internet Access Form: Acceptable Use Policy

I understand that I will be held accountable for all activities including, but not limited to the content of materials sent by mail, news, or any other means using my account privileges.

I agree to abide by the Department of Education guidelines and that my use of this system will be for educational purposes only.

I agree not to hold the Department of Education, the University of Hawaii, the Budget and Finance Information and Communication Services Division, and the Maui High Performance Computing Center nor any of its employees nor any of the institutions or networks providing access to the Internet responsible for the performance of the system or the content of any material accessed through it.

Violations of the Acceptable Use Policy for the Internet will ban the student from a networked computer for one year, and parents immediately will be notified of the infraction and its consequence.

Violations of the Kalakaua Middle School's Acceptable Use Policy are:

1. Using impolite, abusive, or otherwise objectionable language in either public or private messages;
2. Ending or receiving unlawful information via electronic communications;
3. Using electronic communications illegally in way that violate local, state, federal, or international laws or statutes;
4. Using electronic communications at school for personal or non-school related activities;
5. Sending messages that are likely to result in the loss of the recipient's work or system;
6. Sending chain letters or pyramid schemes to list or individuals and any other types of use that would cause congestion on any network or otherwise interfere with the work of others;
7. Using electronic communications for commercial purposes;
8. Using electronic communications for political lobbying;
9. Changing any computer file that does not belong to the user;
10. Giving one's password to others;
11. Using another's password without proper authorization;
12. Using electronic communications for sending or retrieving pornographic material, inappropriate text or graphics files, or files dangerous to the integrity of the network;
13. Using computer programs to decode passwords of access control information;
14. Circumventing security measures on school or remote computers or networks;
15. Attempting to gain access to another's resources, programs, or data without proper authorization;
16. Vandalizing, which is any malicious attempt to harm or destroy data of another user;
17. Falsifying one's identity to others while using electronic communications;
18. Engaging in any activity that might be harmful to systems or to any information stored thereon, such as creating or propagating viruses, disrupting services, or damaging files;
19. Wasting computer resources.
