GREETINGS FROM THE DEPUTY'S REPRESENTATIVE

When I was installed on September 6, 2003 as the Deputy's Representative by M.W. Brother Jim Deyo, I gave a few remarks to those assembled. I think some of the items I put forth to our Valley bear being repeated as a "reminder" to our membership that much work still remains to be done.

- 1. Let's temper our skepticism it fosters a no-win environment and it is a mindset based on the belief that you bear no responsibility for the situation. In the real world, you are either part of the solution, or you're part of the problem. Let's not be critical when someone tries to do something in 32° Masonry.
- 2. Let's earn the right to have expectations if you think something is important enough for others to do, it's important enough for you to do as well. You must make a sincere effort to ensure your behaviors are in sync with 32° Masonic values, philosophies and goals.
- 3. Let's act like a stakeholder you put a lot of hours into Masonry. You have a lot invested in 32° Masonry, and you should care what happens in it and to it.
- 4. Let's never assume we are there I like to relate this to two types of vacations. One, where the destination is the vacation (we're going to Disney World). And the other is where travel itself is the vacation (like we're going to see the country). With destination based vacations, as soon as you arrive, you stop trying to get there. With travel based vacations, the journey usually ends only when you run out of time. Walking the talk together is similar to a travel-based vacation. You're always moving, you never totally get there, and the journey ends only when you die.
