FAA REDUCES ULTRALIGHT CERTIFICATION TEST FLIGHT PERIOD

The FAA has recognized the simplicity of UL vehicles by easing the requirements for their certification as experimental aircraft. In a revised paragraph 133c(2), aircraft that meet the ultralight vehicle design criteria and for which owners wish to receive certification as an experimental amateurbuilt aircraft need only to complete a minimum of 10 hours in a test flight area, including at least 5 take offs and landings, during the initial Phase 1 test flight period.
