PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

Every Easter is New!

The story is the same. The one who was crucified and buried has been raised and He Lives! Death is not final. Sin and evil are not victorious. God wins. And while this glorious centerpiece of our faith remains unchanged in its message of hope, it applies to us in new ways every year. This Easter isn't the same as last year's. You are a different person. This year, the resurrection speaks good news to different challenges. The empty tomb sheds light on new questions. The triumphant Christ moves in new places within us and around our world.

The same is true in our church. This Easter shines light into our particular place and time, always freshly applying its hope to the latest realities. Last Easter, this church was pressing hard toward the goal of breaking ground on a new Sanctuary. The glory of Christ's victory over death reminded us that no challenge is too great for our God. 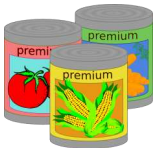

Vacation Bible School

You won't want to miss out on this unique experience, which is quite possibly the most fun Vacation Bible School ever! Each day children will become part of history as they see, hear, touch, and even taste what it was like to live in Jesus' hometown. Children will explore authentic marketplace shops, visit with Jesus' mom, Mary, take part in games, dance to lively songs, and sample tasty tidbits as they discover more about life during Jesus' childhood and early ministry. These experiences make Jesus' teachings come alive with new meaning for all who participate. We will have separate programs for pre-school and elementary children. We have limited enrollment for preschool children (potty-trained 3 & 4 year olds). Children entering kindergarten through 5th grade in August 2015 will participate in our elementary VBS program. Registration opens April 15 on our website (leanderumc.org). We will also have registration forms in the church office. VBS is free to the community and offers many children a first encounter with Jesus. We are planning for just over 250 children, so needless to say we will need lots of help.

Tribe leaders travel with a tribe of approximately 10 children to the various activities for the day. They will begin and end the day in the hometown huddle to make the connection between what the children learn in Nazareth and their daily lives.

Shopkeepers are the citizens of Nazareth, playing the role of a merchant or artisan. Shopkeepers share their belief in Jesus, God's Son, as they engage the children in conversations while they apprentice in the shops.

HOLY DISCOVERY UPDATE

What have we accomplished? A huge "Thank you!" to the almost 90 people who participated in our Holy Discovery Listening Circles over the middle part of March! Your input, perspective, and unique voice will have a lasting impact on our future. We will continue listening to God tell us who we are, who our neighbors are, and what God is calling us to do. We expect the results from our participation in the *U.S. Congregational Life Survey* very soon and will use this data and the listening circle findings to have the most complete and accurate picture of who Leander United Methodist Church is.

What are we doing? Over the next several weeks, your Listening Team (Ray Altman, Jayme Cudworth, Eileen Hale, Kevin Murphy, Renee Purvis, Glenn Suchan, and Kyle Ward) will look at and gather a lot of information: Survey results, Listening Circle findings, Demographic data on our area, suggestions from Amy Butler and the 2014 Outreach Task Force, and community leader interviews. Our task is to compile and arrange that information into a presentable and comprehensible form that we can introduce to a larger group of people during an upcoming Discovery Summit.

What's next? A half-day **Discovery Summit in late April or early May:** This summit is open to anyone in our church who is interested in attending and participating. We will discuss and become very familiar with the information we've gathered to help us discover who we are as Leander United Methodist Church and who our neighbors are. We will allow this information to stand in the light of scripture and prayer, and openly share our impressions about what God is calling us to do in the future. If you are interested in participating, please contact one of the Listening Team members listed above.

What will Holy Discovery produce? This summit will produce the raw material for developing a Mission and Vision statement that will guide and direct our future for the next several years. This is a Holy Discovery of God's unique purpose and dream for our church in this time and place. While not everyone will choose to attend the Discovery Summit, please know that the entire church will have the opportunity to review and approve our Mission and Vision statements before they are adopted.



BUILDING COMMITTEE UPDATE PARKING LOT CONSTRUCTION COMING SOON!

The parking lot sub-committee has been hard at work finalizing plans for a new parking lot and site-work that will provide a dramatically improved west side of our property. The new lot will replace our existing "back" parking, stretch north and include a new entrance/exit at W. South Street. The parking lot will have 58 spots, 7 of them located at the south end of the Fellowship Hall. The site work will prepare our property for future building phases according to our existing plans and include drainage work and an enclosed detention basin near our northwest corner. We will also be adding a six foot wide sidewalk along S. West Street and our front entrance. Once the project is approved by the City of Leander and we get contracts in place we hope construction will begin in April with a 2-3 month project time. Because of your generosity, our current building fund will cover the costs of this important work. Thank you for your continued prayers and support.
